SUBJECT: Approve an agreement with the City of Dinuba

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve an agreement to furnish protection personnel, equipment, materials and supplies, and to provide cooperative fire protection services with the City of Dinuba, retroactive to January 1, 2017. The agreement is retroactive due to inadvertent delays in obtaining authorized signatures.
2. Find that the Board had the authority to enter into the proposed agreement as of January 1, 2017, and that it was in the best interest to enter into the agreement on that date.
3. Authorize the chairman of the Board to sign four (4) copies of the agreement.

SUMMARY:

Tulare County and the City of Dinuba both maintain and operate fire protection organizations within the County's jurisdiction. It is advantageous to both organizations to render aid to one another in fire emergencies when assistance is necessary. Therefore, a cooperative fire protection agreement has been developed between Tulare County and the City of Dinuba.

The purpose of the agreement is to furnish fire protection personnel, equipment, materials and supplies, and to render such emergency services to each other as may be necessary to mitigate emergencies of a size and or complexity that are beyond the control of either party. Each agency agrees to be financially

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responsible for all costs during mutual aid emergency responses.

We would to bring to the Board's attention that there are two provisions in the agreement that deviate substantively from County contract protocol: 1) mutual indemnification and 2) there is not a definitive term of the agreement, although the agreement may be terminated for any reason with 180 days' notice.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Neither agency will incur charges for services from this cooperative fire protection agreement.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Safety and Security Initiative. This action helps provide for the safety and security of the public by providing enhanced availability of resources in fire emergencies.
