SUBJECT: Letters of Support for the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Act

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Approve sending letters of support for the State Water Resources Control Board's Budget Trailer Bill establishing the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Act to the Assembly Budget Committee and the Senate Budget Committee

SUMMARY:

In 2017 Senator Monning introduced SB 623 which provided provisions that would address ongoing operation and maintenance costs of small, disadvantaged communities as well as funding solutions for private domestic wells serving disadvantaged residents. Often these communities face safe drinking water challenges such as aging infrastructure, lack of management and technical expertise, and sound capital improvement plans to operate and maintain a well-functioning system. Further the residents served by these small systems face water rates that are some of the highest in the State, but still do not cover the ongoing operation and maintenance costs.

In order to fund the aforementioned program, SB 623 provided a framework whereby fees would be collected from water system users and fertilizer sales. This framework is broadly supported by the agricultural community because it provides a scaled approach that is predictable and produces an equitable cost sharing between agriculture and public water system users. The bill also protects agriculture from regulatory action stemming from historic practices.

Governor Brown included key budgetary provisions of SB 623 in the FY 17/18 State

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Budget. The remaining components of SB 623 are now included as the State Water Resources Control Board's Budget Trailer Bill.

The Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Act strikes the necessary balance between providing crucial resources for addressing critical drinking water needs, while protecting agriculture from certain nitrate related enforcement actions in the near-term.

To Whom It May Concern:

The Tulare County Board of Supervisors supports the State Water Resources Control Board's Budget Trailer Bill (BTB) which creates the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Act and establishes a fund within the State Water Resources Control Board. The language proposes a modest fee structure that will be assessed on agriculture, urban and commercial water users to ensure necessary upgrades to infrastructure and provide critical financial assistance for operation and maintenance of drinking water systems in disadvantaged communities statewide.

California's farmers and dairies are heavily regulated for water quality issues. These regulations include surface runoff and groundwater quality. In 2007, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board adopted new regulations requiring all dairies to account for manure and fertilizer nutrient applications and exports with limits on how much nitrogen could be applied to cropland. This program requires reporting to the water board of all nutrient applications and exports and is followed up with regular on-farm inspections. Other Regional Boards have followed suit with regulations tailored to their climate, topography, and facility types. Dairies and Irrigated Landowners have hired expert consultants to prepare nutrient management plans, waste management plans, and annual reports that utilize the information from tracking manure quantities and laboratory analyses of manure and plant tissue.

Furthermore, Central Valley dairy producers have formed the Central Valley Dairy Representative Monitoring Program to monitor the progress of these efforts on groundwater quality and report the results to the regional board in publicly available annual reports. This is an extensive effort funded by dairy farms (along with grant funds) that continues to seek improvements to on-farm practices to better protect groundwater quality.

While agricultural practices of the past may have resulted in nitrate reaching groundwater that have caused exceedances of nitrate drinking water standards, the agricultural practices of today significantly reduce or eliminate the potential for nitrates to reach the groundwater.

Nevertheless, farmers and researchers continue to seek opportunities to improve management practices and should not be subject to an enforcement action by the state water board or regional water boards, subject to certain conditions within the timeframe provided by this BTB.

Due to the challenges of reconciling nitrogen use by agriculture with human health and water resource protection, we have been working with the environmental justice community as well as other stakeholders for more than a decade in an effort to address the critical needs in disadvantaged communities relating to safe drinking water. Since these challenges are numerous, both from naturally occurring contaminants and human sources, we believe the solution should be shouldered by a broad array of sources and stakeholders.

The BTB strikes the needed balance between providing necessary resources for addressing critical drinking water needs, while protecting agriculture from certain nitrate related enforcement actions in the short-term.

Again, we are pleased to support the BTB and ask that you pass this item when it comes before you for a vote.
