Approve a purchase from the Visalia Convention Center

#### REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve a purchase from the Visalia Convention Center in an amount not to exceed \$9,650 for use of meeting space and amenities for the 2018 Central Valley Technology Expo & Conference from February 21, 2018.
- 2. Find that the Board had authority to approve this purchase as of February 21, 2018, and that it was in the County's best interest to approve the purchase on that date. It was impractical for the Board to take action prior to February 21, 2018, due to the unforeseen needs for extra space and amenities.

#### **SUMMARY:**

Tulare County Information and Communications Technology (TCiCT) is responsible for maintaining the safety and performance of Tulare County's information technology assets, including the training of County personnel. To support this training initiative, TCiCT contracted with the Visalia Convention Center to provide the annual Central Valley Technology Expo & Conference (CVTEC). This event took place on February 21, 2018. The cost of the meeting space, equipment, amenities, meals and taxes totaled \$7,536.90. This cost was approved by the County Purchasing Agent on November 3, 2017.

After this agreement had been signed, additional services were requested from the venue. Services included additional room space, equipment, electrical needs, refreshments, etc. This added \$2,083.10 in fees and taxes to the total charge.

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TCiCT received notice of this additional charge after the event had concluded. Because the County's Purchasing Department does not have the authority to approve a purchase after the fact, the approval of this Board is needed to pay the invoice

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The cost of this purchase is an amount not to exceed \$9,650 and is included in the FY 2017/18 budget to be paid from account number 071-090-2900-7066. There is no Net County Cost.

### LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Safety and Security Initiative to promote County-wide loss prevention and workplace safety and protect business and individuals from white collar crime. The plan also includes the Organizational Performance Initiative to continuously improve organizational effectiveness and fiscal stability. The leadership workshop held at the Visalia Convention Center helps fulfill both of these initiatives through training programs by increasing employee knowledge of safety and security
