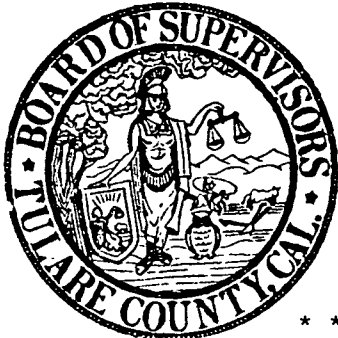

SUBJECT: Approve an agreement with San Joaquin Valley College

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve an agreement with San Joaquin Valley College for a clinical training program for students enrolled in licensed vocational nursing classes retroactive from October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2022. This agreement is retroactive due to inadvertent delays in receiving insurance documents. It was impracticable for the Board to take action prior to October 1, 2017 due to the time required to process, prepare and submit the agenda item;
2. Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed agreement as of October 1, 2017 and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the agreement on that date; and
3. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign three (3) copies of the agreement.

SUMMARY:

San Joaquin Valley College (SJVC) conducts fully accredited licensed vocational nursing classes and is in need of facilities to provide supervised experience for students enrolled in said classes. Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) has a clinical facility in the city of Visalia suitable for the educational needs of San Joaquin Valley College's medical assistant and health operations programs. Tulare County HHSA currently provides students the opportunity to gain

work experience and earn licensure hours by allowing them to intern as paraprofessionals in their field of study. There will be no displacement of allocated staff. All aspects of the clinical training program are conducted in accordance with County and Agency policy and procedure guidelines. Students are placed in various areas within the Agency such as nursing, social work, and as physician assistants; positions that have traditionally been hard to fill. This agreement enhances the County's recruitment process by encouraging students to participate in the program with the hopes of future employment with HHSA and increases the capability of the available labor pool.

Tulare County Agreement No. 25861 was originally approved by the board on February 5, 2013 to provide nursing students training and real world experience from October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2017. This agreement allows HHSA to continue providing these valuable services for an additional five (5) years through September 30, 2022.

This agreement has been approved as to form by County Counsel. The following terms deviate substantively from the standard County boiler plate: 1) Either party may terminate with 30 days advanced written notice, except students currently enrolled must be allowed to finish the current semester; 2) This agreement contains a mutual indemnification clause; and 3) The agreement is for multiple years.


FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The clinical training program has no fiscal impact on any HHSA programs, and it will provide the opportunity for nursing students to gain work experience and enhance the County's recruitment process by increasing the available labor pool. There is no county match requirement with this agreement and there is no additional net cost to the County General fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Economic Well-Being Initiative which promotes a quality standard of living through collaboration and the development of a well-qualified labor pool. This agreement increases the ability to fulfill this obligation.
