REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

The amendment is retroactive due to the format of the amendment provided by the California Department of Public Health. The purpose of this amendment is to update the scope of work and budget to more accurately reflect the program environment. It was impracticable for the Board to take action prior to March 1, 2015 due to the time needed to process, prepare, and submit the agenda item:

SUMMARY:

As part of the State and Local Public Health Actions to Prevent Obesity, Diabetes, and Heart Disease grant, known in California as Lifetime of Wellness: Communities

in Action program, the California Department of Public Health has awarded a contract to the Public Health Branch of the Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency to address uncontrolled and undiagnosed hypertension and prevent diabetes which have a huge impact on the health of Californians. The four-year grant funding in the amount of \$1,927,984 is from March 1, 2015 through September 29, 2018.

This amendment will allow Tulare County to use unspent funds allocated for Year 3 of the contract in Year 4 under a No-Cost Extension. Those changes along with other necessary changes to the scope of work and budget are listed in Exhibits A and B and were approved by the California Department of Public Health.

Tulare County was identified as one of six counties with a high burden of the aforementioned diseases and was awarded the grant on that basis in addition to its ability to carry out the grant requirements. With this grant, the California Department of Public Health is contracting with the Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency to focus on evidence-based primary and secondary prevention measures within target populations in order to prevent diabetes and control hypertension. Health system efforts focus on linking community programs to clinical services for populations with the largest disparities in high blood pressure and pre-diabetes. Program staff estimates that they will reach a total of 68,900 residents with outreach, education, and direct services over the course of the program.

This amendment has been approved as to form by County Counsel. The original agreement contains the following terms which deviate substantively from the standard County boilerplate, which remain unchanged with this amendment: (1) County will sign first; (2) Agreement term is for multiple years; (3) County must indemnify the State generally, and also specifically for any third party claims against the State of property rights infringement; (4) County may not assign or enter any subcontracts for amounts greater than \$2,500 without written consent from the state; (5) State may terminate without cause with thirty days written notice, or immediately for cause, but contract contains no provision for County to terminate; and (6) Contract is dependent upon availability of funds and State may terminate or amend the agreement at any time due to loss or reduction of funds.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The Lifetime of Wellness Program receives its funding from the California Department of Public Health through a grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The average annual grant funding of \$481,996 per federal fiscal year has been budgeted for fiscal years 2014/2015, 2015/16, 2016/17, 2017/18 and will be included in the proposed budget for fiscal year 2018/19. There is no net cost to the County General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Quality of Life Initiative that promotes public health and welfare, educational opportunities, natural resource

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management, and continued improvement of environmental quality. The requests will directly meet this initiative by improving the health of county residents through educating target populations on techniques to prevent chronic disease.
