Approve an agreement with Kings View Corporation

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve an agreement with Kings View Corporation for the provision of services through the Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH) program effective from July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019, in an amount not to exceed \$149,500; and
- 2. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign three (3) copies of the agreement.

SUMMARY:

The Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA), Mental Health Branch, contracts with Kings View Corporation to provide mental health services through the Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH) program. The PATH program is administered by the Center for Mental Health Services, a component of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to provide services to people with serious mental illness. including those with co-occurring substance use disorders, who are experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of becoming homeless. Kings View PATH program staff goes to where the homeless are located and engage the potential clients in an effort to assess their mental health needs, identify whether they are aware of the various mental health services that Tulare County provides, and ideally link them up with needed services.

SUBJECT: Approve an agreement with Kings View Corporation

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This agreement did not include a Request for Proposal, as Kings View has been successfully providing these services since program inception. The Agency aims to continue contracting with this provider to maintain continuity of care and stability, which is integral to working with this population.

It is estimated that through this agreement, Kings View Corporation will directly serve fifty (50) individuals who are homeless or at risk of being homeless and provide outreach to two hundred (200) individuals.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The maximum reimbursement for this agreement is \$149,500 and will be included in the Fiscal Year 2018/2019 budget. These services are paid through a combination of Federal PATH grant funds and Realignment. There is no additional net cost to the County General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Quality of Life Initiative that encourages the innovative provision of quality supportive services for at-risk adults, youth, and children in state and federally mandated programs. This agreement increases the ability to fulfill that obligation by providing services to people with serious mental illness, including those with co-occurring substance use disorders, who are experiencing homelessness or are at imminent risk of becoming homeless.
