REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Approve an agreement with Turning Point of Central California, Inc. for the North County Mobile Unit, in an amount not to exceed \$850,000 to provide mental health services effective from July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019; and
- 2. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign three (3) copies of the agreement.

SUMMARY:

The Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA), Mental Health Branch, collaborates with Turning Point of Central California, Inc. to provide mental health services through the North County Mobile Unit under the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Community Services and Supports (CSS) component.

The North County Mobile Unit program provides an integrated mental health service experience for all age groups with severe and persistent mental illness or serious emotional disturbance with emphasis on serving those traditionally unserved and underserved in the rural communities of North Tulare County. The Mobile Unit strategy is intended to decrease barriers in accessing mental health services seen in rural communities. In addition, integration with Tulare County Public Health and Tulare County Human Services provides consumers with linkages to public health nurses and TulareWORKS safety net programs via the Mobile Unit.

SUBJECT: Approve an agreement with Turning Point of Central California, Inc.

DATE: June

June 26, 2018

From July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, the program plans to provide services to 180 unduplicated consumers in addition to participating in community outreach and engagement opportunities.

Tulare County Mental Health Branch released a Request for Proposal (RFP) in May 2013 for the North County Mobile Unit. Through the proposal process, Turning Point was the only organization to submit an application. The RFP Review Team recommended they be awarded the contract. Turning Point has been providing quality services to the rural communities of Tulare County since being awarded the initial contract in 2006.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Funding for this agreement in an amount not to exceed \$850,000 and will be included in the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 budget. This agreement is paid through Medi-Cal and Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) revenues. There is no additional net cost to the County General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year plan includes the Quality of Life initiative to promote and encourage the provision of quality supportive services for individuals in Tulare County. The North County Mobile Unit program will benefit the residents of Tulare County by providing mental health services that promote health and well-being to the youth and transitional aged youth so that they can grow up to become independent adults and productive members of society.
