

SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2018/2019 Operating Budget for the Seville Water

Company

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve the fiscal year 2018/2019 operating budget for the Seville Water Company (four-fifths vote required): and
- 2. Approve the necessary budget adjustments per the attached AUD 308 form.

SUMMARY:

The County of Tulare currently operates the Seville Water Company, a domestic water system for the Community of Seville, under court appointed receivership. As such, the County Board of Supervisors is required to approve the annual budget to allow the continued operation of the system, at a Net County Cost of \$63,606.

The Seville Water Company provides water to approximately 74 residential connections and the Stone Corral School. The County is about to begin construction of Phase I of the Yettem-Seville water project. Bidding is complete and the contract was awarded June 12, 2018. The project has been split into two phases for construction. The Phase I of construction (Seville Distribution System and Tank) will be funded with Prop 1b State Funds. The Phase II of construction consists of the Yettem to Seville intertie, well and meters. Construction of Phase I is scheduled to begin in the summer of 2018 and be completed in fiscal year 2018-19. The ultimate goal of the current project is to establish a consolidated, sustainable, and independent Yettem-Seville Community Services District.

In the interim, the County is responsible for the maintenance and operations of the Seville Water Company system.

Chronology

On April 28, 2009, the Board of Supervisors approved the County of Tulare becoming the temporary receiver of the Seville Water Company located in the community of Seville.

On June 11, 2009, the Tulare County Superior Court of California (Court) approved Tulare County as the temporary receiver of the Seville Water Company.

Through multiple actions, the Court has approved extensions of the temporary receivership through June 30, 2019.

Rationale for Proposed Budget Action

The Seville Water Company is not part of the County Service Area; and as such, the Water Company's budget needs to be adopted outside the normal County budget approval and adoption process.

Therefore, the attached AUD 308 identifies the proposed appropriations for revenues and expenditures for the operation of the Seville Water Company for fiscal year 2018/2019 to be effective July 1, 2018. With such spending authority, the Water Company may continue to operate without budget constraints.

Active/Upcoming Grants for Future Action Benefitting the County

Importantly, Tulare County has received various grants related to the Seville Water Company. Two of these grants – that are still active – are identified as follows:

- In 2012, Tulare County received funding from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) to identify a new source of water and design a new distribution system for the Seville water system. A portion of that grant intends to address alternative forms of governance such as the formation of a Community Service District.
- In 2013, Tulare County received funding from CDPH to prepare a feasibility study for the North Tulare County Regional Surface Water Treatment Plant Project. The 7 communities involved are currently exploring the different options for governance.
- In July 2016, the County submitted a funding application to the California State Water Resources Control Board for the construction of the Seville and Yettem Water System Project.

The revenues and expenditures associated with these key grants are accounted for in the Seville Water Company budget.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The operating budget for the Seville Water Company includes a Net County Cost of \$63,606.

The objective of the budget is to operate the Seville Water Company, under receivership, at a minimal Net County Cost to the General Fund. Due to the poor condition of the system abnormal maintenance costs have been necessary. The proposed budget includes a request for adequate budget to respond to emergency events from leaks and electrical issues.

Additionally, RMA staff will be enforcing the watering ordinances to reduce the wasteful use of water by residents and minimize or eliminate system depressurization events caused by excessive use.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes a Quality of Life initiative to promote public health and improve environmental quality. Infrastructure improvements assist the Seville and Yettem water systems in meeting safe drinking water standards for its domestic water supply and decreases the contamination risk to human health, as well as the environment.


