

Evaluation Branch, HIV/AIDS Surveillance Program provides precise and timely information necessary to identify ongoing patterns of infection and to measure the burden of the disease. HIV/AIDS Surveillance data provides essential information to describe and monitor trends in infection among geographic and socio-economic groups, plan programs serving affected communities, allocate resources, and develop policies that are more effective. The partnership with local health jurisdictions and health care providers, and HIV testing services are essential for HIV/AIDS surveillance in California.

The Tulare County HIV Surveillance Program uses data, reports, HIV epidemiologic profiles, and HIV prevention activities to assess the needs of the community. This information is utilized to ensure services are delivered appropriately within Tulare County. The estimated number of clients to be served through this agreement is 132 individuals.

This amendment is necessary due to program budget changes in personnel and program expenses. Budget line item shifts are needed in order to fully maximize the yearly-allocated grant amount. Although the department became aware of the need to shift budget line items in mid-2017 and requested an amendment from the State at that time, the amendment was not received from the State until mid-2018. Additionally, the State requires the amendment to reflect the original effective date of the agreement rather than the date the budget changes were implemented. Thus, the amendment is retroactive from July 1, 2016, rather than July 1, 2017.

This amendment has been approved by County Counsel. The following terms deviate substantively from the standard County boilerplate: 1) The County must sign first; 2) It is a multi-year amendment.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

This amendment provides funding to the HIV/AIDS Surveillance Program, granted by the California Department of Public Health Surveillance Research and Evaluation Branch. The total amount payable under this agreement shall not exceed \$85,137 for the term of the agreement July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2019. The amount of \$28,379 will be budgeted in Fiscal Year 2018/2019 budget. The amount of \$28,379 was budgeted in each of the previous two Fiscal Years. This amendment was necessary due to program budget changes in personnel and program expenses. These shifts do not change the grant's original allocation amounts. There is no additional net cost to the County General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

This amendment increases our ability to meet the County's five-year strategic plan, specifically the Quality of Life Initiative that encourages innovative provision of quality supportive services for at-risk adults, youth and children in state and federally mandated programs. This program assists those in our communities by providing essential data to serve the infected population.
