REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Approve an Agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture, to provide State funding of \$20,124.00 to offset costs of providing nursery inspection services for the state Nursery Inspection program for July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. This agreement is retroactive because the document was not received until June 27, 2018.
- Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed Agreement as of July 1, 2018, and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the Agreement on that date.
- 3. Authorize the Chairman to sign two copies of the Agreement.

SUMMARY:

This Agreement is intended to render financial aid to the County to provide nursery inspection services for the state Nursery Inspection program. These services will ensure that agricultural products sold in the County meet the requirements of the state Nursery Inspection program, ensuring all disease and/or pest infested nursery stock is kept out of the market so that only healthy nursery stock will be entering the marketplace.

SUBJECT: Approve an Agreement with the California Department of Food and

Agriculture regarding Nursery Inspections for Fiscal Year 18/19.

DATE: August 14, 2018

This agreement has been approved as to form by County Counsel. The following terms deviate substantively from the standard County boilerplate:

1) Neither party to the agreement will indemnify the other.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No additional net county cost to the General Fund. The County will receive funding up to \$20,124.00 for Fiscal Year 2018/2019 from the California Department of Food and Agriculture. Revenues and the associated expenditures for this program will be included in the Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer's Fiscal Year 2018/2019 budget.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Economic Well-Being Initiative to promote economic development opportunities, effective growth management, and a quality standard of living. This request to authorize an Agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture for the purpose of regulating nursery stock being sold in the county will ensure timely continuance of a long-standing program of protecting the County's agriculture-based economy by ensuring all disease and/or pest infested nursery stock is kept out of the market so that only healthy nursery stock will be entering the marketplace.
