That the Board of Supervisors:

- Authorize the installation of STOP signs on Dooley Drive at Vineyard Drive, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2B.04 of the 2014 California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) and Section 22450(c) of the California Vehicle Code (CVC).

SUBJECT: Two-Way STOP Control on Dooley Drive at Vineyard Drive in Richgrove

DATE: August 14, 2018

SUMMARY:

The intersection of Dooley Drive (D213A) and Vineyard Drive (D208A), is located in the community of Richgrove, within Tulare County. This is currently an uncontrolled intersection with Dooley Drive running diagonally east and west, and Vineyard Drive running diagonally north and south.

In response to concerns by the community regarding traffic and pedestrian safety, Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation and concluded that the installation of Stop signs at this location would enhance and improve traffic and pedestrian safety in the community.

The California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD), Section 2B.04 Right of Way at Intersections, states in part; "State or local laws written in accordance with the 'Uniform Vehicle Code' ... establish the right-of-way rule at intersections having no regulatory traffic control signs such that the driver of a vehicle approaching an intersection must yield the right-of-way to any vehicle or pedestrian already in the intersection ... The right-of-way can be modified at through streets or highways by placing YIELD or STOP signs on one or more approaches."

In addition, the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Section 22450(c), states in part that "a local authority may adopt rules and regulations by ordinance or resolution providing for the placement of a stop sign at any location on a highway under its jurisdiction where the stop sign would enhance traffic safety".

This intersection meets the requirements of Section 2B.04 Right of Way at Intersections, for the installation of a Two-Way STOP control. As such, RMA staff recommends approval for the installation of a Two-Way STOP control on Dooley Drive (D213A) at Vineyard Drive (D208A) in the community of Richgrove.

A Categorical Exemption was prepared by the Tulare County Environmental Planning Division and approved by the Environmental Assessment Officer. The activity/project is considered Exempt under Categorical per Title 14 CCR Section 15061(b)(3), general rule exemption.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No Net County Cost

The cost of installing a Two-Way STOP on Dooley Drive at Vineyard Drive, is budgeted in the current fiscal year's Roads Budget for signs and stenciling.





In response to concerns regarding traffic and pedestrian safety, the Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation. To improve the vehicular circulation and pedestrian safety at this intersection, the Traffic Operations Division determined that this intersection meets the requirements of Section 2B.04 Right of Way at Intersections of the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD), and is consistent with the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Section 22450(c), which states in part that "a local authority may adopt rules and regulations by ordinance or resolution providing for the placement of a stop sign at any location on a highway under its jurisdiction where the stop sign would enhance traffic safety".
