SUBJECT: Approve an agreement with the California Department of Public Health

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve an agreement with the California Department of Public Health to accept funding in the amount not to exceed \$275,000 for California's Personal Responsibility and Education Program, retroactive from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. This agreement is retroactive due to the delay in receiving the agreement from the State. It was impracticable for the Board to take action prior to July 1, 2018 due to the time needed to process, prepare, and submit the agenda item;
2. Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed agreement as of July 1, 2018 and that it is in the County's best interest to enter into the agreement on that date; and
3. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign seven (7) copies each of the agreement, California Civil Rights Laws Attachment, Certification Regarding Lobbying, and Contractor Certification Clauses.

SUMMARY:

Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) is requesting approval of an agreement with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), for Fiscal Year 2018/2019. The agreement enables HHSA, Public Health Branch, to implement the California Personal Responsibility and Education Program (CA

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PREP). CA PREP funds 22 agencies in 20 counties with the highest need for adolescent sexual health education and services. The program's goals include: decreasing teen pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections; supporting youth's personal growth with meaningful opportunities for enrichment to increase resiliency and self-efficacy to avoid harmful behaviors; ensuring access to teen-friendly family and reproductive health planning services; and increasing community support in the development of healthy youth and the reduction of risky sexual behaviors.

CA PREP served 2,247 students in Tulare County in the previous grant cycle between the years of 2015 and 2018. Classes were held in the communities of Tulare, Lindsay, Alpaugh, Porterville, and Terra Bella. Evidence-based curricula was implemented in accordance with the California Healthy Youth Act. For Fiscal Year 2018/2019, program staff plan to reach 1,074 youth. Youth will be reached through partnerships with traditional high schools, middle schools, foster care agencies, and alternative/continuation schools.

The Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency staff has reviewed the terms of the compliance certifications and affirms that the County is in compliance with those terms.

This agreement has been approved as to form by County Counsel. The following term deviates substantively from the standard County boilerplate: 1) The County must sign first.


FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The maximum revenue for this agreement is in the amount not to exceed \$275,000 which is allocated through CDPH, and this amount has been included in the Fiscal Year 2018/2019 budget. There is no additional net County cost to the General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year Strategic Plan includes the Quality of Life Initiative that encourages innovative provision of quality supportive services for at-risk adults, youth and children in state and federally mandated programs. This agreement increases the ability to fulfill that obligation through the implementation of CA PREP.
