SUBJECT:

Tulare County Public Health Laboratory Water Testing Certification

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Authorize expiration of the California Environmental Laboratory Accreditation effective on May 31, 2019, and transition to the California Department of Food and Agriculture certification for the water quality testing program performed at the Tulare County Public Health Laboratory.

SUMMARY:

The Tulare County Public Health Laboratory (TCPHL) is proposing to discontinue Environmental Lab Accreditation Program (ELAP) certification due to an increase in regulatory burdens and increased fees. ELAP accreditation is needed only to provide non-dairy clients with water testing services and is not a mandated service. In order to avoid passing additional fees to these clients and still ensure services are available, clients requiring non-dairy water testing will be assisted by referrals to alternate ELAP water laboratories for their testing needs. TCPHL will be seeking water testing certification through the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) to provide dairy water testing services, which account for the majority of tests performed through the lab, in lieu of using the ELAP accreditation. Certification will be obtained prior to the expiration of the accreditation in order to ensure that no lapse in water testing services for dairy water and regulated systems occurs.

In 2018 the Tulare County Public Health Laboratory provided 938 water tests to 161 clients: 31 water systems and 130 one-time sample individuals, at a fee of \$23 per test. The new ELAP fee would require the Lab to increase this fee to \$50 per test which would make this fee twice the average fee charged by private sector

laboratories performing the same service. The Tulare County Public Health Laboratory has identified 10 alternative laboratories that can provide this testing, and four (4) of which have drop off locations in the cities of Visalia, Tulare, and Porterville.

The elimination of the ELAP accreditation will not impact the dairy water testing services. The Tulare County Public Health Laboratory will maintain its ability to perform dairy water quality testing by obtaining certification through the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA). Should the Board approve this request, the ELAP accreditation will expire May 31, 2019, and be replaced with CDFA certification. Water testing services that do not qualify for CDFA certification will be discontinued effective May 15, 2019. The Tulare County Public Health Laboratory will receive CDFA certification in March 2019.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

There is no cost associated with the California Department of Food and Agriculture certification, therefore; there is no additional cost to the County General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

This proposal links to Tulare County' Strategic Initiative of Organizational Performance, through continuously improving financial stability through the Public Health Laboratory's expenses and to the consumers of the service within Tulare County as water testing fees will not need to be increased.
