Present a Proclamation recognizing March 2019 as Social Work Month

SUMMARY:

Tulare County Health & Human Services Agency employs over 250 social workers who use their talents every day to serve the residents of Tulare County. Social workers are a vital component to strengthening and improving the quality of life of Tulare County residents. Social workers have a critical impact in adolescent and youth development, aging and family caregiving, child protection and family services, health care navigation, mental and behavioral health treatment, community development, and poverty reduction. They confront some of the most challenging issues facing individuals, families, communities, and society and forge solutions that help people reach their full potential.

The National Association of Social Workers has announced the theme for Social Work Month of 2019 as "Elevate Social Work." This theme embodies the need to recognize the extraordinary contributions of the profession to our society. Every day in communities throughout Tulare County, social workers are dedicated to enhancing well-being and helping meet the basic needs of all people, especially those who are vulnerable, oppressed and living in poverty. Social workers elevate and empower people, giving them the ability to solve problems, cope with personal roadblocks and get the resources they need to succeed. Social workers travel across the nation and world to help people in crisis, helping them overcome issues such as death and grief, epidemics, environmental pollution and natural disasters
