Side Letter of Agreement with the Service Employees International

Union, Local 521, Bargaining Units 1,2,3,4,6, & 7.

#### REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Approve a side letter agreement with the Service Employees International Union, Local 521 (SEIU) Bargaining Units 1,2,3,4,6, & 7 regarding language changes to the SEIU Memorandum of Understanding to comply with the U.S. Supreme Court decision of *Janus v. AFSCME* and Senate Bills 866 and 1085.

#### SUMMARY:

On June 27, 2018 the U.S. Supreme Court issued a decision on *Janus v. AFSCME* that deemed collecting agency fees unconstitutional for agency shop unions. In addition, Governor Brown signed into law Senate Bill 866 (SB 866) and Senate Bill 1085 (SB 1085). SB 866 amends and creates new State law regulating: (1) how public employers and employee organizations manage organization membership dues deductions; (2) how public employers communicate with employees about their rights to join or support, or refrain from joining or supporting, employee organizations; and (3) making the location of employee orientations confidential. SB 1085 provides that the County grant employees, upon request from the employee organization a reasonable leave of absence without loss of compensation or other benefits for the purpose of enabling employees to serve as stewards or officers of the Union.

It is the County's intent to remain compliant with Federal and State law as outlined in *Janus*, and Senate Bills 866 and 1085.
