<u>SUBJECT</u>: Authorize a grant application with the California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways for one patrol boat with trailer.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Authorize the submission of an online grant application on April 30, 2019 to the California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways for FY19/20 to purchase one patrol boat and accompanying trailer for the Sheriff's Boating and Safety Enforcement Unit in the amount of \$110,000.

SUMMARY:

On July 21, 2015, the Sheriff's Office assumed supervision of law enforcement marine patrol responsibility for Lake Kaweah and Lake Success along with parts of the Kings River. The transfer was in keeping with the typical practice of California counties to bring patrol of all public waterways under law enforcement.

During FY 17/18, three Sheriff's patrol boats were deemed unusable by the inspector for the California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways and were returned to the State for disposition.

The California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways Boating Safety and Enforcement Grant program is an online application that is due by April 30, 2019. The Sheriff's Office is preparing a grant application to replace one of these three aging patrol boats and accompanying trailers that have reached the end of their service life.

In FY 18/19, the Sheriff's Office applied for the same California State Parks Division

of Boating and Waterways Boating Safety and Enforcement Grant program, asking for the funds to purchase two new boats. The Sheriff's Office was awarded \$130,000 towards the purchase of one new boat and accompanying trailer. The Sheriff's Office is still in need of two new boats.

Today, the Sheriff's Office requests that your Board give approval to submit the online grant application for one boat.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The Sheriff's Office is submitting a grant application for \$110,000 for one new patrol boat and accompanying trailer under the Boating Safety and Enforcement Equipment Grant Program from the California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways. If approved, it is anticipated the grant would pay for the full cost of the boat and trailer. No additional net County cost to the General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Safety and Security Initiative to provide for the safety and security of the public. The authorization to apply for a grant helps fulfill this initiative by ensuring the Sheriff's Office has the equipment it needs to provide for the safety and security of the public. If the Sheriff's grant application for the new patrol boat with accompanying trailer is approved by the State, the equipment will contribute to this initiative.

1. Statement of Need

The Tulare County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) Boating Safety Enforcement Unit (BSEU) is requesting one new jet boat through this grant. In FY 18/19 TCSO requested one jet boat and one prop boat to replace three boats taken out of service, we were awarded partial funding for a prop boat. This year we are asking for the second boat. The requested jet patrol boat, with associated trailer, will be used on our two lakes and river. The boat will also be used in direct support of our Swiftwater Dire Rescue Team and Search & Rescue unit. We have requested the new boat as the State inspector had surveyed three FY18/19 inventory boats and taken them out of service, to be returned to the State, as they are not operational. The three surveyed boats were 1) 2005 Design Concepts and trailer, 2) 2000 Woolridge and trailer, and 3) 2001 Design Concepts with trailer, all three that TCSO had inherited from another agency. The new jet boat will allow our river and lake patrol teams to continue to keep up with the constantly improving, reliable, and safe specialized law enforcement watercraft. Ensuring the public's safety on our waterways by having a minimum of two patrol boats at each location.

When the Sheriff's Office took over responsibilities for lake patrols, they inherited an older fleet of vessels from another non-law enforcement agency. These vessels were not used for the type of patrolling typically experienced by law enforcement for enforcement activities such as traffic stops, search and rescue, or collision response. The vessels were not serviced regularly, the personnel operating them did not attend sanctioned DBW training to safely operate vessels, and the vessels were sometimes left with the engines running at idle for a period of time. Almost all of the vessels and trailers in the inherited original patrol fleet were reaching the end of their service lives when TCSO inherited them, based on condition, age, and engine hours.

TCSO is making this request because Tulare County is not a wealthy county. We are primarily an agricultural region in California's San Joaquin Valley, midway between Los Angeles and the San Francisco Bay Area. At 4,824 sq. miles, Tulare County is approximately the size of the State of Connecticut, with a harvested land mass of 1,745,516 acres. TCSO's area of responsibility includes assisting eight smaller incorporated cities that the County provides services to as needed. Approximately 145,491 residents live in rural areas. The county's total population is 468,235 and is growing faster than 43 of California's 58 counties. The average patrol area for a Sheriff's deputy is 439 square miles at minimum staffing. The Sheriff's Office is funded by a combination of County general fund revenue, and state and federal contracts and grants. Property tax is a principle source for the County's general fund.

Although Tulare County's \$7 billion dairy and agricultural industry ranked No. 2 in the United States, poverty is pervasive. Tulare County is one of the poorest in California with 25.2% of residents living in poverty compared to 15.1 % statewide; one in three residents

receives government aid, one of the largest proportions in California. Approximately 22.5% of Tulare County children live in poverty compared to 16% statewide. Unemployment has consistently been in double digits. As of January 2019, Tulare County has an unemployment rate of 9.6%, the highest of all counties within the San Joaquin Valley. Within our current budget, Tulare County does not have the additional funding to make the needed boat purchases and other equipment costs, allowing our agency to have two operational patrol boats at each area.

The County's low cost of living is attractive to low or un-skilled workers. Adding to that, agriculture is the largest private employer in the county with farm employment accounting for nearly a quarter of all jobs. Many of these are low paying processing and manufacturing jobs, such as field labor and packing house jobs, which sometimes pay minimum wage. These jobs lure nearly 37,000 farm workers during peak harvest seasons, annually. Census estimates for 2010 reveal 45% of all residents speak a language other than English.

With increasing poverty, high unemployment, and limited locations to find recreational waterways, comes a host of challenges for TCSO and the BSEU. The average temperature is over 100 in the summer, with 80-90's for most of the late spring and fall; people are always looking for ways to cool off. Although there are some in our community that have boats or other forms of waterway devices to enjoy the cool water on extremely hot days, there are many others who may not have the financial resources to have pools and visit the waterways as an inexpensive or free form of entertainment. Due to limited waterway experiences and/or financial resources, they may lack the life experience of being on a waterway or safely operating a vessel. They may improvise, rent boats, kayaks, or other forms of water recreation, or buy inflatable devices for use inside and outside the 5-MPH zones. These sometimes-inexperienced people find themselves in unsafe situations or cause a hazard for others. Due to the limited waterway space, the waterways can be congested. Coupled with the experienced waterway user expecting others to follow the written and unwritten rules of waterway use, and those who have not gained that waterway experience, may make for a dangerous and unsafe environment. During FY 17/18 the TCSO BSEU responded to numerous incidents related to rescue in our waterways with five deaths. Unfortunately twoof those incidents led to death by drowning in our Kaweah Lake, one in the St John's River, and two in a canal. These boats will not only be used by our Boating Safety Enforcement Unit, but supports our Swiftwater Dive Rescue Team (SDRT), and Search, and Rescue Unit (SAR), additional units that also respond to waterway incidents.

3. Describe your agency's boating safety and enforcement activities

The Tulare County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) Boating Safety Enforcement Unit (BSEU) operates as the primary Law Enforcement agency responsible to enforce all CA Codes in particular Harbor and Navigation Codes, Penal Codes, Vehicle Codes and County Ordinances. The BSEU will investigate all boating accidents or water-related accidents occurring on Lake Success and Lake Kaweah, or in the vicinity of the lakes, along with the Kings, Kern and Kaweah Rivers and the Tule or St Johns Rivers should there be sufficient rainfall runoff. BSEU will arrest any vessel operator found to be Boating Under the Influence.

Historically, the Tulare County Parks and Recreation Department, who has no law enforcement authority, had patrolled and enforced laws and ordinances on both Lake Kaweah and Lake Success. They did not issue citations, rather they would warn a suspected violator. Both of these lakes are operating as two large reservoirs, operated by the U.S. Corps of Engineers and heavily used by the public for recreation. In the past, prior to our agency taking over responsibility of the lakes, the Sheriff's Office had only patrolled the Kings River during the summer months. In July 2015, the County chose to consolidate law enforcement patrol of the lakes and the rivers to come under the Sheriff's Office to be consistent with waterway patrol practices across the state.

BSEU crews will respond and render aide to any boating accident, drowning or other major incident on the lake or within the lake vicinity. BSEU will conduct an investigation and submit all required reports to involved agencies that include Cal Boating, Army Corps of Engineers and the District Attorney's Office.

During normal daily operations, the BSEU crews will conduct vessel and equipment safety inspections at the boat ramp prior to launch or while on the water during vessel stops. The crew will focus on ensuring the public understands safe vessel operation and maintaining proper safety equipment and issue citations if warranted. The BSEU crews will participate in and provide Safe Boating demonstrations at public events as requested. These include the Tulare County Fair and a Public Lands Day sponsored by the Army Corps of Engineers at both Lake Kaweah and Lake Success.

The above listed functions were developed from Cal Boating Law Enforcement training programs and the 30 plus years of the Sheriff's Office boating enforcement operation on the Kings River within Tulare County. The BSEU patrols Lakes Kaweah and Success on a year-round basis. Patrols on the Kern, Kaweah and Kings Rivers are done on a seasonal basis.

Kings River and Lake Patrol Coverage

BSEU will operate a minimum of one vessel on each lake and the Kings River, which will be staffed by a minimum crew of two Deputy Sheriff's. One Sergeant will directly supervise the BSEU crews of each lake and river. Both lakes will operate for a 12-hour shift, seven days a week during the peak months of May thru October and 10-hour shifts during off peak months. The Kings River crews will operate on weekends between Mid-May and Mid-September, depending on water flow. The Kings River Patrol operates 13-hour shifts, three days per week, (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday) that cover the peak weekly use by the public. BSEU crews will also cover any mid-week holidays or special events outside the regular three-day weekend on an as needed basis. The Kings River Patrol Schedule is dependent on water flow. The river is used for fishing, waterskiing, pleasure boating, and other water-related activities. Dependent on river flow and depth, along with the busy holidays, the BSEU will also operate jet skis for more efficient response.

Kern River

The Kern River is primarily used for commercial and recreational fishing; white-water

rafting; and kayaking. The river cannot accommodate motorized vessels. The Kern River is patrolled by Resident Deputies eight hours per day, seven days a week when conditions permit. The patrols are conducted on foot and in vehicles. The months of April through September are considered peak months where river patrols and river specific calls for service are the primary duty of two stationed Resident Deputies. During the three largest events held on our river during Memorial Day weekend, 4th of July, and Labor Day weekend, we have our SDRT / SAR stationed at the river. They are there to support the immediate needs of the crowded river as well as enhanced enforcement and education of waterway visitors.

Kaweah River

The Kaweah River is used primarily for commercial and recreational fishing; white-water rafting; and kayaking. The river cannot accommodate motorized vessels. The months of June through September are considered peak months where river patrols and river specific calls for service are the primary duty of one stationed Resident Deputy.

Lake Success

Lake Success is near Porterville, California on the Tule River and is formed by Success Dam with a capacity of 82,000 acre-feet covering 2,450 acres and 30 miles of shoreline. The 156 feet tall earth dam is owned and operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers with four launch ramps. In February 2018, the Corp requested funding through Congress to increase the height of the dam spillway by 10 feet and widen it another 165 feet (to 365 feet wide), allowing for the storage of up to another 28,000 acre feet of water. Raising and widening the spillway would increase maximum storage to just over 100,000 acre-feet and take the top of the lake to within a foot of the Highway 190 Bridge. The project's primary purpose is flood control, but the lake also provides water for irrigation and recreation such as sailing, water skiing, kayaking, swimming, and fishing year round. The lake has an operational marina, County operated park with 103 campsites, playgrounds, hiking trails, with individual and group picnic areas. The marina allows permanent parking for up to 30 houseboats.

Lake Kaweah

Lake Kaweah is a reservoir near Lemon Cove in Tulare County, California with three launch ramps. The lake is formed by Terminus Dam on the Kaweah River. The river originates in the San Joaquin Valley beneath the Sierra Nevada mountains and drains about 560 sq. miles into Lake Kaweah. From Lake Kaweah, the river flows toward the city of Visalia, splitting into the Kaweah River and St. Johns River as it flows west into the Tulare Lakebed. The lake has a capacity of 185,000 acre-feet, 1,945 acres, 30 miles of shoreline, and provides flood protection to downstream communities allowing agricultural land to be increased. Because its primary purpose is flood control, Lake Kaweah is maintained at a lower water level for part of the year, and generally fills between May and June. The lake offers 80 campsites, a marina, numerous picnic areas, swimming, boating, water skiing, and sailing. The marina allows permanent parking for up to 298 houseboats.

5. Describe the recreational boating activity on your waterways:

Tulare County's exceptionally warm climate in the fall and spring seasons and mild weather in the winter, results in Lake Success and Lake Kaweah along with the Rivers being used for recreation year-round. The peak season is late spring until early fall. The Kings, Kern, and Kaweah River's recreational season typically spans late spring into summer and late fall. Depending on rain fall and reservoir capacity, the Tule River, north and south forks, along with the St. John's River may see modestly flowing water, enough to allow for water activities. The recreational boating activities on our waterways encompass all forms of water sports such as sailing, kayaking, fishing, water skiing, pleasure boating, jet skiing, wake skating, knee boarding, parasailing, and swimming. With temperatures normally over 100 degrees every day in the summer, swimming activities increase tremendously. Rental boats and kayaks are available on the lakes and white water rafting on the rivers, allowing those that do not have equipment to enjoy the water.
