GOOD WORKS FUNDING AGREEMENT

This agreement (Tulare County Agreement No. 26071, or the "Agreement") is made and entered into between the COUNTY OF TULARE, a political subdivision of the State of California ("COUNTY") and Visalia Chamber of Commerce ("RECIPIENT"), tax ID # 94-0957521, as of the date signed by COUNTY below, with reference to the following Recitals:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Government Code section 26227 authorizes the Board of Supervisors to appropriate and expend money from the general fund of COUNTY to meet the social needs of the population of COUNTY including, but not limited to, the areas of health, law enforcement, public safety, rehabilitation, welfare, community vitality, education, and legal services, and the needs of physically, mentally, and financially handicapped persons and aged persons; and

WHEREAS, at the request of Supervisor Kuyler Crocker, Amy Shuklian, Eddie Valero, the County Administrative Officer has evaluated RECIPIENT's COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES and determined that (a) such activities meet the requirements of the POLICY and Government Code section 26227, and (b) there are sufficient budgeted funds available to fund RECIPIENT's COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES in the amount of \$ 1,000.
