SUBJECT: Hills Valley Irrigation District

#### REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Approve request by the Hills Valley Irrigation District to change from oddnumbered to even-numbered year elections, with the election to be consolidated with the General Election in 2020.

#### SUMMARY:

Special districts may submit a resolution to the Board of Supervisors to establish an election day to occur on the same date as the Statewide General Election. (Elections Code 10404). The resolution must be received not later than March 10, 2019, 240 days prior to the currently scheduled election of the district.

Hills Valley Irrigation District met the deadline, submitting its resolution on March 6, 2019. As required by law, the Clerk of the Board has sent a notice to all special districts located in the County, advising them of the receipt of the resolution and asking for their input. The notice also advised that the agenda item would be heard today. As also required by law, a special notice regarding this agenda has been posted on a County website.

The Elections Code requires the Board of Supervisors to approve the request unless it finds that the ballot style, voting equipment, or computer capacity is such that additional elections or materials cannot be handled. The election official provides an Impact Analysis for this purpose. As indicated in the attached Impact Analysis, the Registrar believes this election can be added without affecting the ability of the County to provide services for the General Election.

If the request is approved, the terms of the district board members will be extended for one year. The election official will notify all registered voters in the district of the change of election date at the expense of the district.

Once changed, the regular board of directors for the Hills Valley Irrigation District will thereafter occur in consolidation with the Statewide General Election, unless the resolution is appealed or amended after at least one election is held on the new date. Consolidation will lower the district's costs. Any costs to the County will be offset by reimbursement revenue received from the district.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

By terms of this Resolution, the District would bear its own share of costs of the election. The Election Official's Report with Impact Analysis per Election Code 10404(d) is attached.

Election Official's Report

#### **IMPACT ANALYSIS**

Since June 2006, Tulare County has been using Sequoia Voting Systems ballots (Insight Vote machine). The Insight is an optical scan ballot reader which readily accepts additional consolidations. Neither the ballot nor the precinct counter capacity will be affected by the consolidation.

Speed of reporting election night results will not be affected by the additional contest. The consolidation will have an insignificant impact on the length of the time for the official canvass and reconciliation of records.

#### COST EFFECTIVENESS

No regularly scheduled federal, state or county elections are held in the odd numbered years when the Hills Valley Irrigation District is currently scheduled to elect the Board Members. No other Districts in the area currently have odd year elections.

None of these districts are required to have an election if the nominees are equal to or less than the vacancies, therefore districts which actually go to the ballot have few agencies with which they share election costs.

Consolidation with the Statewide General Election should save the district money because the County will always share a portion of the total election cost. Additionally, a portion of the election costs will potentially be shared with the many local districts with even year general elections.

Any costs to the County because of the consolidation will be offset by reimbursement revenue received from the district for its prorated share of the election costs.

WHEREAS, the Directors of the Hills Valley Irrigation District currently are elected at-large in odd-numbered years; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code section 10404 provides that a special district may, by resolution, require that its election of governing body members beheld in the same election cycle as the Statewide General Election; and

WHEREAS, said Board of Directors has determined that the consolidation with the Statewide General Election would result in significant cost savings to the District; and

WHEREAS, said Governing board has requested the Board of Supervisors of Fresno County and the Board of Supervisors of Tulare County to consent to and order said election of Directors to occur in the same election cycle as statewide general elections; and

WHEREAS, such consolidation could save the District money; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has caused notice of the receipt of the resolution to request that the District's election of Directors be allowed to occur in the same cycle as statewide general elections be transmitted to all districts located in the County requesting input from each district on the effect of consolidation pursuant to Elections Code section 1004(c)

### NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE HILLS VALLEY IRRIGATION DISTRICT HEREBY FINDS AND RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Board finds that changing from odd to even year elections could reduce election costs, could increase voter participation and is in the best interest of the District;
- 2. The Board requests the Fresno County Board of Supervisors and the Tulare County Board of Supervisors each approve changing from odd to even year elections; and
- 3. If approved by the Fresno County Board of Supervisors and the Tulare County Board of Supervisors, the Board of Directors acknowledges that, by operation of law, the terms of all existing members of the Board of Directors shall be extended by one year.
