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SUBJECT: Agreement with Dominion Voting Systems, Inc.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Waive the formal competitive bidding process for the sole-source purchase of a new voting system.
- 2. Approve an agreement with Dominion Voting Systems, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$1,049,012 for the purchase of the Democracy Suite 5.2 Voting System.
- 3. Approve shipping costs in an amount not to exceed \$15,000.
- 4. Authorize the Chairman to sign four copies of the Agreement.
- 5. Approve the budget adjustment in the amount of \$106,012 per the attached AUD 308 (4/5ths vote required).

SUMMARY:

The Secretary of State has been advocating for additional and ongoing funding for California election modernization and administration. On January 29, 2019, the Board of Supervisors approved an agreement with the State of California, Secretary of State in the amount of \$958,000 for the reimbursement of funds for the replacement of a new voting system with a dollar-for-dollar County match. The total cost of the voting system including equipment, licenses, warranties, shipping and sales tax is \$1,064,012. Therefore, we are requesting approval of a budget adjustment in the amount of \$106,012 to cover the additional cost.

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Some older voting systems are at or near their life expectancy, with some voting system vendors no longer providing replacement parts or tech support. For that reason, on February 27, 2019 the California Secretary of State released a Memorandum withdrawing the certification and conditional approval of all voting systems not tested and certified to the California Voting System Standards. Additionally, the Memorandum stated that after February 28, 2020, the voting system we are currently using may no longer be used, except for those jurisdictions that have received a Conditional Approval for Extension of Use by the Secretary of State.

The Registrar of Voter's Department is requesting the Board to waive the competitive bid process and authorize the sole-source purchase of the Democracy Suite 5.2 Voting System from Dominion Voting Systems, Inc. Currently, there are only two (2) voting systems that have been tested and certified to the California Voting System Standards by the California Secretary of State. Over the past 13 years, Tulare County has worked with Dominion Voting Systems, Inc. and their customer service and dedication has proven to be unparalleled. In addition, thirty-one (31) of the fifty-eight (58) counties in California are under contract with Dominion.

As the Secretary of State continues to strongly encourage counties to adopt the Vote Center Model, the Dominion Democracy Suite 5.2 Voting System will allow us the flexibility to easily transition when the time comes. The Democracy Suite 5.2 Voting System also increases functionality, system security and greatly improves the efficiency of adjudication and tabulation.

The adjudication process is one of the more time consuming tasks during the canvass period of an election. Dominion's ImageCast adjudication function will help to alleviate this process by enabling easy, on-screen adjudication of voter intent issues. The Dominion ImageCast adjudication application examines such voter exceptions as overvotes, undervotes, blank contests, blank ballots, write-in selections, and marginal marks. ImageCast's AuditMark technology offers next level transparency by producing a transparent, easy to read chain of custody and activity log for all adjudication decisions.

Dominion's 821D HiPro scanner has the ability to scan approximately 12,000 ballots per hour. It is equipped with two input/output trays, which allows the operator to continually load and tabulate ballots. The scanner is designed to detect a double feed ballot error, which will divert ballots to a separate output tray so they can be processed at a later time while still allowing the operator to continue tabulation without interruption.

The OKI C931e Mobile Ballot Printers will enable printing precinct specific ballots on demand. They print at a speed of approximately 1,500 ballots per hour. The printers have been designed for high quality, duplex printing.

SUBJECT: Agreement with Dominion Voting Systems, Inc. **DATE:** May 7, 2019

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Tulare County approved an agreement with the Secretary of State for reimbursement funding in the amount of \$958,000 to be used for replacing our current voting system. Use of this funding does require a dollar-for-dollar County match. The attached AUD 308 will cover the remaining costs related to the cost of the equipment, licenses, warranties, shipping and sales tax in an amount not to exceed \$106,012. Money is available in the Elections Fund to meet the required County Match. There will be no net County cost.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's Five-year Strategic Plan includes the Organization Performance Initiative to provide state-of-the-art technology and infrastructure to support better service delivery. Approving the request to purchase the Dominion Democracy Suite 5.2 Voting System helps fulfill this initiative by ensuring that we are improving the functionality, system security and efficiency of conducting elections.
