SUBJECT: Permission to Apply for CALFIRE Volunteer Fire Assistance (VFA) Program

REQUEST(S):
That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve the submission of a grant application to the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection Volunteer Fire Assistance (VFA) Program to purchase wildland fire suppression equipment.
2. Authorize the Fire Chief, or his designee, to sign and electronically submit the grant application.

SUMMARY:
The Tulare County Fire Department is proposing to request grant funding from the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CALFIRE) Volunteer Fire Assistance (VFA) Program. The purpose of the grant request is to provide for the purchase of replacement radios, wildland hose, wildland helmets/goggles, wildland web gear, wildland hose packs and wildland hose clamps.

The Tulare County Fire Department consists of a combination of 116 paid fire personnel and approximately 129 extra-help/paid call firefighters. This combination of personnel provide fire prevention and suppression, emergency medical services, and other emergency responses from 27 County Fire Stations with 34 fire engines, 17 patrols, 6 water tenders and 2 aerial fire trucks. Three of the stations are staffed with 2 full time persons, and the remaining 24 are staffed with one full time person supported by extra-help/paid call firefighters who respond from their home when their pagers are activated simultaneously with the Fire Station alarm system. The Tulare County Fire Department provides fire protection services to over 50

communities with a population under 10,000.

Extra-help Firefighters are faced with an ever-increasing number of hazards in their work environment. It is the department's responsibility to provide them with the necessary resources to protect them from those hazards. Due to diminishing budgets, it has been difficult to fully fund our wildland replacement program. Obtaining this grant will allow our firefighters to not only protect themselves, but also protect those who entrust their well-being to them.

If awarded, this grant will directly have a positive effect on the daily operations of the Tulare County Fire Department for the following reasons:

- It will continue to improve and enhance mutual aid and cooperative agreements within the state responsibility areas.
- The replacement of hose, radios, and wildland equipment will improve the safety of the firefighters as well as the citizens they serve.
- The communication equipment will replace non-compliant devices, updating to modern technology.
- The funding will also assist with a reduction in maintenance and repair costs.

Although this is a grant application, the County is required to make certain certifications when submitting its application. The following terms in the application deviate substantively from the standard County boilerplate for contracts:

County agrees to hold harmless CALFIRE and its employees for any liability or injury suffered through the use of property or equipment acquired under this Agreement.


FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The project total cost is \$36,553, with a 50/50 match funding required equating to \$18,266 State Funds and \$18,266 County Funds. If awarded, the grant will be received during Fiscal Year 2019-20. Grant related expenditures and revenues will be included in the Fiscal Year 2019-20 Budget and matching funds will be part of the Fire Department's operating budget.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Safety and Security initiative, which calls for planning and coordinating emergency preparedness and response. Approval of this request will support efforts to provide necessary emergency equipment for support personnel and first responders.

This combination of personnel provide, fire prevention and suppression, emergency medical services and other emergency responses from twenty seven (27) County Fire Stations with thirty four (34) fire engines, seventeen (17) patrols, six (6) water tenders and two (2) aerial fire trucks. Three (3) of the stations are staffed with two (2) full time persons, the remaining twenty four (24) stations are staffed with one (1) full time person supported by extra-help firefighters that respond from their home when their pagers are activated simultaneously with the Fire Station alarm system. The Tulare County Fire Department provides fire protection services to over fifty (50) communities with a population under 10,000.

It is the departments' responsibility to provide them with the necessary resources to protect them from those hazards. If awarded, this grant will directly have a positive effect on the daily operations of the Tulare County Fire Department for the following reasons:

- The replacement of hose, radios and wildland safety equipment will improve the safety of the firefighters as well as the citizens they serve
- The communication equipment will replace antiquated devices, updating to modern technology.
- This funding will also assist with a reduction in maintenance and repair costs.
