**<u>SUBJECT</u>**: Authorization to Bid 2019 Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) Project 1

#### REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Adopt the Categorical Exemption prepared pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the State CEQA Guidelines General Rule Exemption per Section 15300.4 Application by Public Agencies and Section 15301 Existing Facilities, respectively, for the 2019 Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) Project 1; and
- 2. Authorize the Environmental Assessment Officer, or designee, to sign and file the Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk; and
- 3. Approve the Plans, Special Provisions, Proposal and Contract ("Bid Documents") for the construction of the 2019 Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) Project 1; and
- 4. Authorize the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors to sign the Plans; and
- 5. Approve the advertisement for bids of the 2019 Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) Project 1.

#### SUMMARY:

#### Background

In April of 2017, California passed Senate Bill 1 – The Road Repair and Accountability Act. This bill establishes a new funding source for road repairs and other maintenance

through revenue from gas taxes, vehicle registration fees and other transportation related fees. A significant portion of these funds will be distributed to local agencies in the form of Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA) funds (a.k.a. SB 1 funds). To receive these funds, a local agency must demonstrate transparency on the utilization of the funds by including a project list in an adopted budget. This project list must identify the projects with a project description, location, schedule, and estimated useful life.

On April 24, 2018, your Board identified and approved the project description, locations, schedule, and estimated useful life per RMRA guidelines for the following three projects in the County's Fiscal Year 2018/2019 Budget: (1) 2019 Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) Project 1, (2) 2019 Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) Project 2, and (3) 2019 Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) Project 3.

These three RRAA projects account for 22 locations for over 35 miles of roads to be repaired.

#### The 2019 Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) Project 1

The 2019 Road Rehabilitation and Accountability Act (RRAA) Project 1 is a road maintenance project consisting of the repair of asphalt materials on multiple segments of existing County roads in the northern region of Tulare County. The Project is intended to enhance the safety and security of the public by providing well maintained public roadways. The work to be done consists, in general, of a combination of isolated pavement repairs followed by the installation of new (replacement) asphalt surfacing, as well as full depth pulverization of existing asphalt materials followed by the application of new (replacement) asphalt surfacing. All project locations will include corrective work to be performed on the shoulders of the roadways. In addition, all newly resurfaced roadways will receive new traffic stripes and pavement markings. The Project does not include any new travel lanes or any expansion to the existing roadways.

Provided below is a summary of the project locations:

- Location 1 Road 152 from Avenue 256 to State Route 137
- Location 2 Road 144 from State Route 201 to Avenue 416
- Location 3 Road 122 from Avenue 272 to Avenue 271, Avenue 271 from Road 122 to Road 128, and Road 128 from Avenue 271 to Avenue 272
- Location 4 Avenue 264 from Road 100 to Road 108
- Location 5 Road 108 from Avenue 317 (Pratt) to Avenue 328
- Location 6 Road 224 from Fir to Avenue 250

In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the County has also determined that two categorical exemptions: State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs.) Section 15300.4 Application by Public Agencies and Section 15301 Existing Facilities, respectively, are applicable to the proposed action.

#### **Proposition 6 Ballot Initiative and Revised Project Schedule**

California Proposition 6 (a.k.a. Prop 6) was a ballot measure proposed in November of 2018 to repeal the Senate Bill 1 – the Road Repair and Accountability Act. The Measure failed with approximately 57% of voters against and 43% in favor. This enables Tulare County to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling project.

Although the Prop 6 Ballot Initiative failed, County staff postponed all spending on the 2019 RRAA Projects as SB 1 funding was uncertain. This resulted in delaying the project schedule for the 2019 RRAA Projects approximately 6 to 9 months.

With SB1 funding certain, County staff was able to complete the design for the 2019 RRAA Project 1. The Plans and Specifications for the 2019 RRAA Project 1 are complete and ready to be approved by the Board of Supervisors. Construction is anticipated to begin Summer of 2019.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No Net County Cost.

Funding for the 2019 RRAA Project 1 will be funded entirely through County road funds. Revenue sources for the County Road fund include State Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), Local Measure R, and other State and Federal roads funding sources.

RMRA funds in the amount of approximately \$11.4 million are projected to be received in Fiscal Year 2018/2019.



The Project consists of repairing asphalt materials on multiple segments of existing County roads. The work includes a combination of isolated pavement repairs followed by the installation of new asphalt surfacing, as well as full depth pulverization of existing asphalt materials followed by the application of new asphalt surfacing. All projects will include corrective work (adding a thin course of granular material for leveling to minimize drop-off heights for overlays) to be performed on the shoulders of the roadways. Further, all newly surfaced roadways will receive new traffic stripes and pavement markings. Efficient and responsive maintenance of the County road network will enhance the safety and security of the public by improving the transportation infrastructure for the general population throughout the region. Construction is anticipated to begin during the Summer of 2019. Exempt Status: (check one)

Reasons why project is exempt: This action is consistent with Section 15301 Class 1, Existing Facilities (c) Existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities. Also, consistent with Section 15300.4, Application by Public Agencies, the County of Tulare Board of Supervisors adopted an exemption for the construction of the aforementioned facilities per the Tulare County Guidelines for the Implementation of California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, Section 300 (c)(14). Therefore, the use of CEQA Section 15301 and Tulare County Guidelines for the Implementation of CEQA of 1970, Section 300(c)(14) are applicable and appropriate for this project.
