SUBJECT: All-Way STOP Control at the Intersection of Avenue 256 and Road 124, South of Visalia

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Approve a Categorical Exemption consistent with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Title 14 California Code of Regulations (CCR), Section 15061(b)(3) general rule exemption;
- 2. Find there is no substantial evidence that proposed activity will have a significant effect on the environment and determine the Categorical Exemption is consistent with the CEQA Title 14 CCR, Section 15061(b)(3) general rule exemption, that was prepared for the project reflects the independent judgment of the County and completed in compliance with the CEQA of 1970;
- 3. Direct the Environmental Assessment Officer of the Tulare County Resource Management Agency, or designee, to file a Notice of Exemption with the Tulare County Clerk.
- 4. Approve the designation of an All-Way STOP control at the intersection of Avenue 256 and Road 124, south of the city of Visalia; and
- 5. Authorize the installation of STOP signs on Avenue 256 at the intersection of Road 124 in accordance with the provisions of Section 2B.07 of the 2014 California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) and Section 22450(c) of the California Vehicle Code (CVC).

SUBJECT:All-Way STOP Control at the Intersection of Avenue 256 and Road 124,
South of VisaliaDATE:June 4, 2019

SUMMARY:

The intersection of Avenue 256 (Oakdale) and Road 124 is located south of the City of Visalia, within Tulare County. This location is currently a Two-Way Stop controlled intersection with stop signs on Road 124, which runs north and south, and Avenue 256 which is uncontrolled running east and west. Both roadways have a prima facie speed limit of 55 miles per hour.

In response to safety concerns at this intersection, Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation.

Section 2B.07 <u>Multi-Way Stop Applications</u> of the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) states in part "Multi-way stop control can be useful as a safety measure at intersections if certain traffic conditions exist. Safety concerns associated with multi-way stops include pedestrians, bicyclist, and all road users expecting other road users to stop." Due in part to the high through traffic volume, this intersection does meet the following traffic condition:

"Five or more reported crashes in a 12-month period that are susceptible to correction by a multi-way stop installation. Such crashes include right turn and left turn collisions as well as right angle collisions."

In addition, the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Section 22450(c), states in part that "a local authority may adopt rules and regulations by ordinance or resolution providing for the placement of a stop sign at any location on a highway under its jurisdiction where the stop sign would enhance traffic safety".

This intersection meets the requirements of Section 2B.07 for the installation of a Multi-Way Stop. As such, RMA staff recommends approval of the installation of an All-Way STOP control at the intersection of Avenue 256 (Oakdale) and Road 124.

A Categorical Exemption was prepared by the Tulare County Environmental Planning Division and approved by the Environmental Assessment Officer. The activity/project is considered Exempt under Categorical per Title 14 CCR Section 15061(b)(3), general rule exemption.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No Net County Cost to the General Fund.

The cost of installing All-Way STOP signs on Avenue 256 at the intersection of Road 124 is budgeted in the current fiscal year's Roads Budget for signs and stenciling.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

Strategic Initiative: Safety and security includes the goal of improving and maintaining adequate transportation infrastructure. Installation of an All-Way STOP control at this location will enhance intersection circulation and safety.



Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Activity / Project: This project will enhance vehicular circulation and safety at the intersection of Avenue 256 and Road 124, south of the City of Visalia, CA. This intersection is currently a Two-Way Stop controlled intersection, with Stops on Road 124.

In response to concerns regarding traffic safety at this intersection, the Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation. To improve the vehicular circulation and safety at this intersection, the Traffic Operations Division determined that this intersection meets the requirements of Section 2B.07 <u>Multi-Way Stop Applications</u> of the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD), and is consistent with the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Section 22450(c), which states in part that "a local authority may adopt rules and regulations by ordinance or resolution providing for the placement of a stop sign at any location on a highway under its jurisdiction where the stop sign would enhance traffic safety".
