<u>SUBJECT</u>: Adopt the Categorical Exemption for the M348 South Fork Kaweah River Bridge Revegetation Project

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Adopt the Categorical Exemption prepared pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the State CEQA Guidelines per Section 15333 Small Habitat Restoration Projects, for the M348 South Fork Kaweah River Bridge Revegetation Project; and
- 2. Authorize the Environmental Assessment Officer, or designee, to sign and file the Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk.

SUMMARY:

In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the County of Tulare, acting as the lead agency for the M348 South Fork Kaweah River Bridge Project, must adopt the Categorical Exemption (CE) prior to proceeding with the project.

The County, in cooperation with Caltrans, proposes to replace the existing functionally obsolete (narrow) and fracture critical bridge on M348 over the South Fork Kaweah River. Located approximately 12 miles southeast of the community of Three Rivers, the existing structure (constructed in 1952) will be replaced with a wider one-lane, clear-span, steel girder bridge with precast or cast-in-place concrete deck panels. Also located approximately 0.42 miles from Sequoia National Park, this bridge primarily serves recreational and forestry vehicles traveling to South Fork Campground at the terminus of South Fork Drive. Due to the lack of an available

detour and to accommodate traffic during construction, the replacement structure will be constructed along a new alignment upstream of the existing bridge.

Due to the new alignment, construction of the project will require removal of several riparian trees located within or near the South Fork of the Kaweah River. In accordance with California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) permit requirements, all tree removal within CDFW jurisdiction must be mitigated by performing either on-site or off-site revegetation and restoration. Due to the limited availability of on-site space, the County has selected the Sequoia Riverlands Trust (SRT) Homer Ranch Preserve for the off-site restoration efforts. Located approximately 17 miles northwest of the Project site, the preserve is within the Project's watershed and has been approved by CDFW.

SRT will be responsible for all site preparation, irrigation, planting and monitoring needed to establish the proposed restoration area. County staff will provide oversight of the restoration efforts and review of yearly monitoring reports to CDFW. It is estimated that off-site mitigation will cost up to \$225,000, including staff management and review efforts. Staff is currently working with Caltrans on securing the Revegetation Project funding. Once approved, staff will request that your Board approve a Program Supplement with Caltrans to allow reimbursement for Revegetation Project costs.

Bridge construction is anticipated to begin in the fall of 2020, and should take approximately 6 months to complete all work. In accordance with CDFW permit requirements, all mitigation planting shall to be completed within one year of tree removal (anticipated November of 2020). The off-site revegetation and restoration phase will require an establishment period of approximately 5 years, placing Project completion around November of 2025.

In accordance with CEQA, the County determined that a categorical exemption is applicable to the proposed action: State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs.) Section 15333, Small Habitat Restoration Projects.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No Net County Cost.

It is anticipated the Highway Bridge Program will fund this project at a 100% reimbursement ratio with the use of "toll credits" (no local match required).

County Road Funds will be used to fund this Project, but will be fully reimbursed by Federal Highway Bridge Program funds.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

This project will enhance the safety and security of the public by improving the transportation infrastructure for both the general population in the region and the motorists using this facility.



Attachment A - Vicinity Map


