## REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Approve an Agreement with the California Crop Improvement Association (CCIA) for providing \$912.00 to offset costs of providing seed certification inspections, retroactive to July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The Agreement is retroactive because the signatory page was changed to have the chairman of the board of supervisors sign instead of the Agricultural Commissioner.
- 2. Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed Agreement as of July 1, 2019, and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the Agreement on that date.
- 3. Authorize the Chairman to sign two copies of the Agreement.

#### SUMMARY:

CCIA seed certification inspections have for years have been an important regulatory element for agriculture within the county, state, and nationwide. These inspections ensure seed that enters the marketplace is free from disease and pests. The detection of these pests and diseases is critically important to the agricultural industry. This is done through field, harvesting, and shipment inspections. This agreement is intended to provide funding for these various seed inspections.

This agreement has been approved as to form by County Counsel.

SUBJECT: Approve an Agreement with the California Crop Improvement Association regarding seed certification inspections DATE: July 23, 2019

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No additional net County cost to the General Fund. This Agreement provides \$912.00 to the County for providing seed certification inspections. The costs and revenues are recurring for this program. The revenue and associated expenditures for this detection program have been included in the Agricultural Commissioner's Fiscal Year 2019/2020 budget.
