SUBJECT: All-Way STOP Control at the Intersection of Avenue 248 and Road

124, east of Tulare

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve the designation of an All-Way STOP control at the intersection of Avenue 248 and Road 124, east of the city of Tulare; and
- Authorize the installation of STOP signs on Avenue 248 at the intersection of Road 124 in accordance with the provisions of Section 2B.07 of the 2014 California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) and Section 22450(c) of the California Vehicle Code (CVC).
- 3. Approve a Categorical Exemption consistent with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Title 14 California Code of Regulations (CCR), Section 15061(b)(3) Common Sense exemption;
- 4. Find there is no substantial evidence that proposed activity will have a significant effect on the environment and determine the Categorical Exemption is consistent with the CEQA Title 14 CCR, Section 15061(b)(3) Common Sense exemption, that was prepared for the project reflects the independent judgment of the County and completed in compliance with the CEQA of 1970; and
- 5. Direct the Environmental Assessment Officer of the Tulare County Resource Management Agency, or designee, to file a Notice of Exemption with the Tulare County Clerk.

SUBJECT: All-Way STOP Control at the Intersection of Avenue 248 and Road 124,

east of Tulare

DATE: July 30, 2019

SUMMARY:

The intersection of Avenue 248 and Road 124 is located east of the city of Tulare, within Tulare County. This location is currently a Two-Way Stop controlled intersection with stop signs on Road 124, which runs north and south, and Avenue 248 which is uncontrolled running east and west. Both roadways have a prima facie speed limit of 55 miles per hour.

In response to the increase of traffic volumes and safety concerns to include left turn conflicts at this intersection, Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation.

Section 2B.07 <u>Multi-Way Stop Applications</u> of the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) states in part "Multi-way stop control can be useful as a safety measure at intersections if certain traffic conditions exist. Safety concerns associated with multi-way stops include pedestrians, bicyclist, and all road users expecting other road users to stop...other criteria that may be considered in an engineering study include the need to control left-turn conflicts...susceptible to correction by a multi-way stop installation."

In addition, the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Section 22450(c), states in part that "a local authority may adopt rules and regulations by ordinance or resolution providing for the placement of a stop sign at any location on a highway under its jurisdiction where the stop sign would enhance traffic safety".

This intersection meets the requirements of Section 2B.07 for the installation of a Multi-Way Stop. As such, RMA staff recommends approval of the installation of an All-Way STOP control at the intersection of Avenue 248 and Road 124.

A Categorical Exemption was prepared by the Tulare County Environmental Planning Division and approved by the Environmental Assessment Officer. The activity/project is considered Exempt under Categorical per Title 14 CCR Section 15061(b)(3), common sense exemption.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No Net County Cost to the General Fund.

The cost of installing All-Way STOP signs on Avenue 248 at the intersection of Road 124 is budgeted in the current fiscal year's Roads Budget for signs and stenciling.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

Strategic Initiative: Safety and security includes the goal of improving and maintaining adequate transportation infrastructure. Installation of an All-Way STOP control at this location will enhance intersection circulation and safety.







This intersection is currently a Two-Way Stop controlled intersection, with Stops on Road 124. The project consists of installing Stop signs on Avenue 248 at Road 124, resulting in an All-Way STOP controlled intersection. In response to concerns regarding traffic safety at this intersection, the Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation. To improve the vehicular circulation and safety at this intersection, the Traffic Operations Division determined that this intersection meets the requirements of Section 2B.07 Multi-Way Stop Applications of the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD), and is consistent with the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Section 22450(c), which states in part that "a local authority may adopt rules and regulations by ordinance or resolution providing for the placement of a stop sign at any location on a highway under its jurisdiction where the stop sign would enhance traffic safety". **Exempt Status:** \square Ministerial (PRC Sections 21080(b)(1); 15268)); □ Declared Emergency (PRC Sections 21080(b)(3);15269(a)); □ Emergency Project (PRC Sections 21080(b)(4);15269(b)(c)); X Categorical Exemptions: General Rule Exemption: (14 Cal. Reasons Why Activity/Project are Exempt from CEQA: This activity/project is intended to enhance vehicular circulation and safety, and as noted above, meets the requirements of Section 2B.07 Multi-Way Stop Applications of the CA MUTCD and CVC Section 22450(c). As such, the activity/project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to the "common sense" exemption on the ground that it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity (installation of stop signs) may have a significant effect on the environment (14 Cal. Code Regs., §15061, subd. (b)(3)).
