SUBJECT: Approve an Agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture regarding High Risk terminal inspections for Fiscal Year 19/20.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve an Agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture, to provide State funding of \$24,254.00 to offset costs of providing high risk terminal inspection services for the state High Risk Inspection program from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. This agreement is retroactive because the document was not received until July 8, 2019.
- 2. Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed Agreement as of July 1, 2019, and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the Agreement on that date.
- 3. Authorize the Chairman to sign two copies of the Agreement.

SUMMARY:

The High Risk terminal inspection program is responsible for enforcement of federal, foreign and domestic plant pest quarantines, as well as California state exterior and interior quarantines and county restrictions and ordinances. Inspectors conduct agricultural product inspections at airport, maritime, truck, rail, U.S. Mail and commercial parcel carrier facilities and terminals throughout California. The High

Risk program helps protect California and Tulare county agriculture from invasive weeds and pests.

This agreement has been approved as to form by County Counsel. The following terms deviate substantively from the standard County boilerplate:

1) Neither party to the agreement will indemnify the other.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No additional net county cost to the General Fund. The County will receive funding up to \$24,254.00 for Fiscal Year 2019/2020 from the California Department of Food and Agriculture. Revenues and the associated expenditures for this program will be included in the Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer's Fiscal Year 2019/2020 budget.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Economic Well-Being Initiative to promote economic development opportunities, effective growth management, and a quality standard of living. This request to authorize an Agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture is for the purpose of performing high risk terminal inspections which serve to protect the County's agriculture-based economy by ensuring all disease and/or pest infested produce and nursery stock is kept out of the marketplace.
