### REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Receive a presentation regarding the Extra Help Firefighter Program

### **SUMMARY:**

The Extra Help (Volunteer) Firefighter Program has been in existence in Tulare County since the early formation of County Government services. Until recently, most Volunteer Firefighters performed their duties during a time when community service and volunteerism were high and people joined the program to help within their community. Extra Help Firefighters, previously called "paid on-call firefighters", have always been an essential component of the fire department as they are utilized to supplement full-time staffed fire stations to provide assistance with fire suppression and prevention duties. Over the past ten years, volunteerism has greatly declined as more people have financial stresses and require a full-time job. At present, County Fire is facing challenges with recruitment and retention of Extra Help Firefighters, mainly due to positions being temporary, having unstable schedules, and lack of applicants at remote station locations.

Prior to 2000, the Extra Help Firefighter program training standards were regulated by the employer rather than state law or national standards, and extra help firefighters only required eight hours of initial training. In 2000, mandated training hours increased to 16 hours and currently, the total training required is now 148 hours in order to be in compliance with national standards. Additional training requires completion of a linear academy, use of live fire training props, and various courses to meet certification requirements. Extra Help Firefighters must also

maintain consistent monthly training and fire drills as required by the Insurance Services Office (ISO). The department also offers and encourages advanced training options for Extra Help Firefighters.

# FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Annually, the County Fire hires about 100 to 150 Extra Help Firefighters to assist with various programs, suppression and prevention duties. One Extra Help Firefighter costs the department approximately \$8,000, including hiring requirements; background, physical/medical testing, academy training, personal protective gear, uniforms, instructor and staff time. On average, the fire department spends roughly \$600,000 annually to hire Extra Help Firefighters for enhanced service delivery.

### LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The Extra Help Firefighter Program has always been an essential component of the fire department. The Program is linked to the Organizational Performance Initiative of the Tulare County Strategic Business Plan which promotes continuous organizational structure to improve service delivery.
