SUBJECT: Approve an Agreement with Central Valley Recovery Services.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve an Agreement with Central Valley Recovery Services in an amount not to exceed \$350,000, to provide offenders recently realigned under Assembly Bill (AB) 109 with residential treatment, training services, and outpatient services, retroactive from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. This Agreement is retroactive due to extended negotiations and inadvertent delays in obtaining signatures. It was impractical for the Board to take action prior to July 1, 2019 due to time needed to process, prepare, and submit the Agenda Item;
2. Find that the Board had the authority to enter into the proposed Agreement as of July 1, 2019, and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the Agreement on that date; and
3. Authorize the Chairman to sign three (3) copies of the Agreement.

SUMMARY:

Central Valley Recovery Services (CVRS) is a non-profit, community-based facility that provides residential and out-patient substance abuse treatment for adult felony

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offenders. Referrals include individuals subject to Post-Release Community Supervision, in addition to individuals placed on Mandatory Supervision or Formal Probation pursuant to Sections 1170(h) and 1203 of the Penal Code. CVRS is committed to providing treatment and case management services in an effort to break the course of addiction, improve the quality of lives, and reduce recidivism.

In an effort to address the provisions of AB 109, and the influx of 1) Low-Level State Prison Post-Release (PRCS); 2) Low-Level Non-Violent, Non-Serious, and Non-Registerable Sex Offenders; 3) Existing violators of Parole who will not be returned to State Prison; and 4) Any offenders who are placed on Felony Probation, the Probation Department needs to enter into contracts and linkages with community-based services for placement, treatment, counseling, employment, education, and training of such individuals.

The Probation Department has an established relationship with Central Valley Recovery Services, which has received referrals and provided treatment interventions to adult offenders since October 10, 2011.

This Agreement does not substantively deviate from the standard County Boilerplate.


FISCAL IMPACT / FINANCING:

The Agreement cost for services from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 with Central Valley Recovery Services is in an amount not to exceed \$350,000, which will be included in the Probation Department's FY 2019/2020 operational budget. The costs associated with the agreement are offset by revenue received from SB 678 and AB 109. There are no net County costs to the General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic business plan includes the Safety and Security initiative that provides for the safety and security of the public. The approval of this agreement helps fulfill this initiative by contracting with Central Valley Recovery Services for community-based treatment services designed to improve the quality of lives and reduce recidivism.
