Highlights of the Changes to the California Building Code

- Provides for greater Fire and Life Safety for all newly constructed buildings.
- Greater Energy Efficiency.
 - Mandatory solar panels on all new construction.
 - 15% or greater efficiency leading to net zero goal in 2020.
- Newly developed building materials and systems.
- Continues to allow inspections for newly installed Manufactured Homes greater than ten years.
 - 196 Mobile Investigation Permits (Eighteen of which were denied)
- Continues to reduce the need for Fire Suppression Water Tanks
 - Single story Single Family Dwellings, Mobile and Manufactured Homes <2500 sq. ft.
 - Two story Single Family Dwellings >3000 sq. ft.

Request to the Board of Supervisors

- Hold a Public Hearing regarding the proposed Ordinance Amendments regarding 2019 Building Code Adoptions.
- Introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance amending Chapter 15 of Part VII of the Ordinance Code pertaining to building regulations in Tulare County.
- Set the second reading for December 17, 2019.
- Direct the Clerk to publish a summary of the ordinance before the second reading as required by law.
