REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Authorize the submission of an application to the Governor's Office of Emergency Services for the Federal Fiscal Year 2019 Emergency Management Performance Grant, in an amount not to exceed \$221,021;
- 2. Authorize the Clerk of the Board to sign four (4) copies of the attached Governing Body Resolution to appoint Authorized Agents to act on behalf of the County in securing and administering grant funds;
- 3. Authorize the Health and Human Services Agency Director or designee, as Authorized Agents, to sign the "California Governor's Office of Emergency Services Grant Subaward Face Sheet," and the initial application for the Emergency Management Performance Grant;

SUMMARY:

The purpose of the Emergency Management Performance Grant is to support comprehensive emergency management at the state, tribal and local levels and to bolster preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation capabilities across all hazards. The State of California distributes this funding annually to each of the 58 California counties using a population-based formula. The Federal Fiscal Year 2019 grant funds, in the amount of \$221,021, will be used to support the staffing and programmatic activities of the Tulare County Office of Emergency Services. The grant will be allocated to eligible activities including Staffing, Day-to-Day Operating Expenses, Training, and Planning.

Each year, the Governor's Office of Emergency Services announces the application period for the Emergency Management Performance Grant in October, with funding approved on a retroactive basis to July 1. As with the Federal Fiscal Year 2018 grant, the Governor's Office of Emergency Services has opted to issue Notification of Award Approval letters prior to the receipt of grant applications. Unlike prior years, the Federal Fiscal Year 2019 Emergency Management Performance Grant

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has extended the performance period from 12 to 24 months. As the Office of Emergency Services has sufficient expenses to fully expend the grant within one fiscal year, staff plans to continue to utilize the grant as a single fiscal year program. Should it become necessary in the future to carry forward unexpended funds, staff will address this through the annual budget development process.

The Tulare County Health & Human Services Agency staff has reviewed the terms of the compliance certifications and affirms that the County is in compliance with these terms.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The Emergency Management Performance Grant is an annual recurring grant awarded to the Tulare County Office of Emergency Services (fund line 001-142-6082), which funds a majority of the program's expenses across the Personnel (6000), Services & Supplies (7000), and Inter-fund (9500) appropriation units and associated object lines. The entirety of this grant award is budgeted in Fiscal Year 2019/2020's adopted budget. Staff does not anticipate any carryover or other fiscal impacts from the extended 12-month performance period into Fiscal Year 2020/2021. Any carryover funding would be addressed through the County budget development process for Fiscal 2020/2021. The revenue amount is \$123 more than the amount included in the Fiscal Year 2019/2020 adopted budget; this increased revenue will be applied to planned program expenditures and as such no budget adjustment is required.

The grant award requires a 50% local cost share which is allocated from the program's General Fund allocation for Fiscal Year 2019/2020 adopted budget. There is no additional net County cost to the General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Safety and Security element, with an initiative to provide coordinated emergency preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation capabilities for both natural and man-made disasters. The Emergency Management Performance Grant enables the Tulare County Office of Emergency Services to fulfill this initiative by providing staffing and other activities in support of emergency preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation capabilities.
