SUBJECT: STOP Controlled Intersections in the Community of Cutler

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve the designation of a One-Way STOP control at the following intersections: Cutler Drive (D126) at Railroad Drive (D128B), Santa Fe Drive (D125B) at Railroad Drive, Topeka Road (D124B) at Railroad Drive, Short Avenue (LA405) at Road 124, Amethyst Avenue (LA406A) at Road 124, Avenue 407 at Road 124 and a Two-Way STOP controlled intersection on First Drive (D129B) at Santa Fe Drive (D125B), in the community of Cutler; and
- 2. Authorize the installation of a STOP sign on Cutler Drive at Railroad Drive, Santa Fe Drive at Railroad Drive, Topeka Road at Railroad Drive, Short Avenue at Road 124, Amethyst Avenue at Road 124, Avenue 407 at Road 124 and two STOP signs on First Drive at Santa Fe Drive, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2B.04 of the 2014 California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) and Section 22450(c) of the California Vehicle Code (CVC).
- 3. Approve a Categorical Exemption consistent with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Title 14 California Code of Regulations (CCR), Section 15061(b)(3) Common Sense Exemption;
- 4. Find there is no substantial evidence that proposed activity will have a significant effect on the environment and determine the Categorical Exemption is consistent with the CEQA Title 14 CCR, Section 15061(b)(3) Common Sense Exemption, that was prepared for the project reflects the independent judgment of the County and completed in compliance with the CEQA of 1970; and

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5. Direct the Environmental Assessment Officer of the Tulare County Resource Management Agency, or designee, to file a Notice of Exemption with the Tulare County Clerk.

SUMMARY:

These intersections are located in the Community of Cutler within Tulare County. Cutler Drive, Santa Fe Drive and Topeka Road all "T" into Railroad Drive and Short Avenue, Amethyst Avenue and Avenue 407 all "T" into Road 124. Railroad Drive becomes Road 124 creating a through highway from State Route 63 (R128) to Avenue 408 and these "T" intersections are currently uncontrolled. First Drive (D129B) at Santa Fe Drive (D125B) is not a "T" intersection but it is also an uncontrolled intersection with very wide roadways. Community concerns have been raised about traffic and pedestrian safety.

In response to these concerns regarding traffic and pedestrian safety, Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation and concluded that installation of Stop signs at these locations would enhance and improve traffic and pedestrian safety throughout the community.

The California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD), Section 2B.04 Right of Way at Intersections, states in part; "State or local laws written in accordance with the 'Uniform Vehicle Code'... establish the right-of-way rule at intersections having no regulatory traffic control signs such that the driver of a vehicle approaching an intersection must yield the right-of-way to any vehicle or pedestrian already in the intersection... The right-of-way can be modified at through streets or highways by placing YIELD or STOP signs on one or more approaches."

Section 2B.04, paragraph 3 further states "YIELD or STOP signs should be used at an intersection if one or more of the following conditions exist:

- A. An intersection of a less important road with a main road where application of the normal right-of-way rule would not be expected to provide reasonable compliance with the law;
- B. A street entering a designated through highway or street; and/or
- C. An unsignalized intersection in a signalized area."

In addition, the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Section 22450(c), states in part that "a local authority may adopt rules and regulations by ordinance or resolution providing for the placement of a stop sign at any location on a highway under its jurisdiction where the stop sign would enhance traffic safety".

These intersections meet the requirements of Section 2B.04 Right of Way at Intersections, for the installation of One-Way and Two-Way STOP controls at these intersections. As such, RMA staff recommends approval for the installation of these One-Way and Two-Way STOP controls at the intersections stated above, in the community of Cutler.

A Categorical Exemption was prepared by the Tulare County Environmental Planning Division and approved by the Environmental Assessment Officer. The activity/project is considered Exempt under Categorical per Title 14 CCR Section 15061(b)(3), Common Sense Exemption.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No Net County Cost to the General Fund.

The cost of installing the One-Way and Two-Way STOPs at these locations, is budgeted in the current fiscal year's Roads Budget for signs and stenciling.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

Strategic Initiative: Safety and security includes the goal of improving and maintaining adequate transportation infrastructure. Installation of the One-Way and Two-Way STOP controls at these locations will enhance intersection circulation and pedestrian safety.





These intersections are currently uncontrolled, with no Stop signs. In response to concerns regarding traffic and pedestrian safety, the Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation. To improve the vehicular circulation and pedestrian safety at these intersections, the Traffic Operations Division determined that these intersections meet the requirements of Section 2B.04 Right of Way at Intersections of the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD), and is consistent with the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Section 22450(c), which states in part that "a local authority may adopt rules and regulations by ordinance or resolution providing for the placement of a stop sign at any location on a highway under its jurisdiction where the stop sign would enhance traffic safety". **Exempt Status:**
