Application for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5339

Grant for Replacement of Transit Bus

#### REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Authorize the Resource Management Agency Director, or his designee, to file and execute applications on behalf of the County of Tulare with the California Department of Transportation (the "Department") to aid in the financing of capital/operating assistance projects pursuant to Section 5339 of the Federal Transit Act (FTA C 5100.1), as amended; and
- Authorize the Chairman of the Board or his designee to execute and file all certification of assurances, contracts or agreements or any other document required by the Department; and
- 3. Authorize the Resource Management Agency Director or his designee to provide additional information as the Department may require in connection with the application for the Section 5339 projects; and
- 4. Authorize the Resource Management Agency Director or his designee to submit and approve request for reimbursement of funds from the Department for the Section 5339 project(s).

#### **SUMMARY:**

The Grants for Buses and Facilities Program (49 U.S.C. Section 5339) provides for federal grants, made through the State, for public transportation projects, such as the replacement or purchase of buses and related equipment. In California, the

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5339 program is administered by Caltrans on behalf of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA).

Staff is proposing that the County submit a grant application in the amount of \$510,000 for Fiscal Year 2019, which, if awarded, would be used for the purchase of one CNG bus to replace one CNG bus that have reached their useful life as part of the transit fleet. This is a competitive grant and the funding agency may decide to award the County one or none of the request.

The bus to be replaced would be replaced with a larger type and capacity 35' Class H bus with the necessary accessories estimated at \$510,000 each. The total for the purchase of the bus is estimated at \$510,000, and the grant would cover 88.53% of this cost. The County would be liable for a local match of 11.47%, or \$58,497, for which the County would use either toll credits if available, Measure R Capital funds, and/or other designated transit funds. Toll credits are federal funds available at the state level to help agencies meet their local match requirements for federal grants.

If awarded, the County would replace TCaT Bus #7116, which was purchased in 2008 with FTA 5311 funds. This vehicle has in excess of 700,000 miles and is 11 years old in excess of useful service life. The referenced bus has a useful service life of 150,000 miles and 5 years. This bus has had various engine and transmission replacements to extend their service lives.

Staff are requesting delegation of authority for the filing and execution of the grant application to the Resource Management Agency Director or his designee to comply with the requirements of submission through the online BlackCat Grants Management System that Caltrans uses. The language used for the requests and resolution match the sample resolution language provided by Caltrans.

The Certification of Assurances required for this grant application is the same as is required for other federal transit assistance programs including the 5311 program by the Federal Transit Administration and was previously executed by the Chair and submitted for 2019 under Resolution 2016-0412. Any new agreements or certifications and assurances required to execute the grant if awarded will be presented to your Board for consideration.

Staff intend to purchase any bus awarded under the 5339 program through the CalACT/MBTA Purchasing Cooperative.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

There are no net County costs to the General Fund.

This grant would provide for capital to purchase a bus for approximately \$510,000. This grant would provide 88.53% of the cost to purchase, which is approximately \$451,503, and would require a local match of 11.47%, which is approximately

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\$58,497. However, a smaller local match could be required from the County if toll credits are available from the state. The County will use Measure R Capital funds for its share of the local match, and staff will present a program supplement to this effect for consideration by your Board upon award of the grant and determination of the availability of toll credits.

#### LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

This program links to Strategic Initiative 1: Safety and Security includes the goal of improving and maintaining adequate transportation infrastructure. The proposed action meets this initiative by allowing receipt of federal funds for use in providing public transportation.

Tulare County Area Transit (TCaT) is a rural transit system providing fixed-route service on four intercity routes and five local circulator routes, as well as Dial-A-Ride demand-response bus services with four distinct service areas serving eighteen unincorporated communities, as well as the City of Lindsay and certain areas and neighborhoods outlying other cities. These services connect rural communities to urbanized areas--the cities of Visalia, Porterville, Tulare, and five smaller cities.

Fixed-route service hours vary according to the route but generally operate from 5:15 a.m. to 8:15 p.m. Dial-A-Ride hours vary by service area but generally operate from 6:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

TCaT covers over 1,100,000 revenue miles a year and served 277,471 riders in FY 2018/19. Tulare County is the second largest agricultural producing area in the United States and is located in California's San Joaquin Valley basin and is predominately rural in nature with 75.6% of its population located in non-urban areas. The per capita income is \$11,606 for Hispanics who comprise 60.6% of the population in Tulare County which is one of the most impoverished counties in California.

Bus transportation is a key method of transportation services for the transit dependent, low income families and senior citizens. Transportation to medical facilities, social service agencies, employment, and institutions of higher learning are typically only found in the urbanized areas of Porterville, Tulare, and Visalia. TCaT is the primary linkage between the transit dependent rural residents and these services, as well as providing a link between most of the cities within the County and a connection to Delano in Kern County.

TCaT had previously used PTMISEA to purchase buses, but this program is no longer be available; TCaT is now seeking other sources of funding to replace its aging fleet. TCaT currently has 24 active buses in its fleet, with three currently programmed for replacement using FTA Section 5339 2018 funding.

The bus proposed for replacement (#7116) under this FTA Section 5339 2019 application. Bus #7116 has over 700,000 miles per bus and was purchased in 2009, which puts it well beyond its useful life of 150,000 miles and 5 years. Various transmissions and engines replaced in order to keep it on route and maintenance costs are expected to rise.

Beyond those currently slated for replacement, TCaT has eight additional buses which are at or beyond their useful life, both for mileage and for years of service.

TCaT proposes to replace three (1) bus under this application. The bus would be 35' Class H Bus.
