SUBJECT: Approve a Cooperative Agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture for a Bee Safe Program

REQUEST(S):
That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve an Agreement Number 19-0798-000-SG with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) in the amount not to exceed \$45,491.63 for the Bee Safe Program, retroactive to July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The agreement is retroactive because it was received on October 16, 2019.
2. Find that the board had authority to enter into the proposed agreement as of July 1, 2019, and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the agreement on that date.
3. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign the Cooperative Agreement.
4. Approve a Categorical Exemption consistent with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Title 14 California Code of Regulations (CCR), Section 15061(b)(3) Common Sense Exemption and 15308 Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection.
5. Find there is no substantial evidence that the ordinance will have a significant effect on the environment and determine the Categorical Exemption is consistent with the CEQA Title 14 CCR, Section 15061(b)(3) Common Sense Exemption and 15308 Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection, that

SUMMARY:

This Agreement is intended to render State financial aid to the County for providing the implementation of the Bee Safe Program. The main objectives of the Bee Safe Program are to reduce honeybee stress through improved apiary theft prevention efforts, decrease apiary pest pressure, decrease apiary stress due to pesticide exposure, and increase apiary foraging opportunities.

This agreement has been approved as to form by County Counsel. The following term deviates substantively from the standard County boilerplate:

Indemnification: Neither party to the agreement agrees to indemnify the other

In accordance with CEQA, the County has also determined that a categorical exemption is applicable to the proposed action: State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) Common Sense Exemption and 15308 Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:


There is no additional net County cost to the General Fund associated with this action. This Agreement provides \$45,491.63 to the County for the protection of bees. There is no net County cost to the General Fund. The revenue has been included in the FY2019/2020 Agricultural Commissioner's budget.
