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**SUBJECT**: All-Way STOP Control at the Intersection of State Drive and Sutter

Avenue in Earlimart

### REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve the designation of an All-Way STOP control at the intersection of State Drive (D136A) and Sutter Avenue (D133A), in the community of Earlimart; and
- Authorize the installation of STOP signs on State Drive at the intersection of Sutter Avenue in accordance with the provisions of Section 2B.07 of the 2014 California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) and Section 22450(c) of the California Vehicle Code (CVC).
- 3. Approve a Categorical Exemption consistent with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Title 14 California Code of Regulations (CCR), Section 15061(b)(3) common sense exemption;
- 4. Find there is no substantial evidence that proposed activity will have a significant effect on the environment and determine the Categorical Exemption is consistent with the CEQA Title 14 CCR, Section 15061(b)(3) common sense exemption, that was prepared for the project reflects the independent judgment of the County and completed in compliance with the CEQA of 1970; and
- 5. Direct the Environmental Assessment Officer of the Tulare County Resource Management Agency, or designee, to file a Notice of Exemption with the Tulare County Clerk.

**SUBJECT**: All-Way STOP Control at the Intersection of State Drive and Sutter

Avenue in Earlimart

**DATE**: December 17, 2019

#### **SUMMARY:**

The intersection of State Drive and Sutter Avenue is located in the community of Earlimart, within Tulare County. This location is currently a Two-Way Stop controlled intersection with stop signs on Sutter Avenue (D133A), which runs diagonally east and west, and State Drive (D136A) which is uncontrolled, running diagonally north and south. State Drive has a posted speed limit of 35 miles per hour and Sutter Avenue has a prima facie speed limit of 25 miles per hour.

The Earlimart Middle School is located on the southeast corner with Sutter Avenue as the school's northern boundary. There are crosswalks on the south and east approaches to the intersection with a gas station convenience store on the northeast corner attracting many of the pedestrian children, before and after school. In response to traffic and pedestrian safety concerns at this intersection, Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation.

Section 2B.07 <u>Multi-Way Stop Applications</u> of the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) states in part "Multi-way stop control can be useful as a safety measure at intersections if certain traffic conditions exist. Safety concerns associated with multi-way stops include pedestrians, bicyclist, and all road users expecting other road users to stop." Other criteria for consideration includes "The need to control vehicle/pedestrian conflicts near locations that generate high pedestrian volumes."

In addition, the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Section 22450(c), states in part that "a local authority may adopt rules and regulations by ordinance or resolution providing for the placement of a stop sign at any location on a highway under its jurisdiction where the stop sign would enhance traffic safety".

This intersection meets the requirements of Section 2B.07 for the installation of a Multi-Way Stop. As such, RMA staff recommends approval of the installation of an All-Way STOP control at the intersection of State Drive and Sutter Avenue.

A Categorical Exemption was prepared by the Tulare County Environmental Planning Division and approved by the Environmental Assessment Officer. The activity/project is considered Exempt under Categorical per Title 14 CCR Section 15061(b)(3), common sense exemption.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No Net County Cost to the General Fund.

The cost of installing All-Way STOP signs on State Drive at the intersection of Sutter Avenue is budgeted in the current fiscal year's Roads Budget for signs and stenciling.

### LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

Strategic Initiative: Safety and security includes the goal of improving and maintaining adequate transportation infrastructure. Installation of an All-Way STOP control at this location will enhance intersection circulation and pedestrian safety.





In response to concerns regarding traffic and pedestrian safety, the Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) conducted an investigation. Reasons Why Activity/Project are Exempt from CEQA: This activity/project is intended to enhance vehicular and pedestrian safety, and as noted above, meets the requirements of Section 2B.07 of the CA MUTCD and CVC Section 22450(c). As such, the activity/project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to the "Common Sense" exemption on the ground that it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity (installation of stop signs) may have a significant effect on the environment (14 Cal. Code Regs., §15061, subd. (b)(3)).
