SUBJECT: Approve an agreement with Turning Point of Central California, Inc.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve an agreement with Turning Point of Central California, Inc., to replace and supersede PA4557 and PA4558, for the provisions of drug and alcohol recovery treatment services to Tulare County adolescents, and men's residential services, in an amount not to exceed \$1,636,458, effective from January 28, 2020 through June 30, 2020; and
2. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign two (2) copies of the agreement

SUMMARY:

The Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) Collaborates with Turning Point of Central California, Inc. to provide alcohol and drug treatment services to non-perinatal adults, as well as adolescents and their families. The adolescent program focus is on outpatient drug treatment through individual and group counseling which may include drug education, recovery groups, anger management, parent support groups and gender specific groups. The residential drug treatment program provides non-perinatal consumers with substance use disorders (SUD) the opportunity to live healthier lives through a safe and drug-free residence, in addition to group and individual counseling sessions, focused on overcoming barriers caused by SUDs, and linkages to the community, which enable beneficiaries to continue pursuing their recovery when they leave the program.

In addition, Turning Point provides community recovery-based services including

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participation in alcohol and other drug related community prevention events, and character development activities. Turning Point operates under the regulations of the State of California Department of Health Care Services as outlined in Title 9 of the Administrative Code. It is estimated that 500 adolescents and 100 adults will utilize the services of Turning Point through this agreement.

This agreement did not include a Request for Proposal (RFP) process because Turning Point has been a long-standing contractor for alcohol and substance abuse treatment. This agreement supersedes PA4557 and PA4558 to consolidate agreements with Turning Point for SUD services, as well as increase the agreement amount to account for projected Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) and Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant (SABG) services being provided.

This agreement does not deviate from standard County boilerplate.


FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The budgeted costs associated with this agreement were included in the HHSA 6068 budget, line 7052, medical providers, for \$1,636,458 for Fiscal Year 2019/20. The funding is derived from DMC and Realignment funds. The remaining amount will be paid through the SABG. SABG will be utilized only in the event a beneficiary is not DMC-eligible and does not have private insurance. There is no additional net cost to the County General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Quality of Life Initiative that encourages innovative provision of quality supportive services for at-risk adults, youth and children in state and federally mandated programs. This agreement increases the ability to fulfill that obligation through residential, outpatient, intensive outpatient, and transitional programs.
