#### REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Terminate the Proclamation of a Local Emergency due to Livestock Deaths, Resolution No. 2020-0071.

#### SUMMARY:

On February 24, 2020, Tulare County was notified by Baker Commodities that its livestock rendering facility in Kerman was down for repairs, and would temporarily suspend carcass pick-ups. As rendering is the only permitted disposal means for most livestock operations, and there is lack of alternative carcass transportation and disposal sites, alternative disposal methods were required to mitigate potential public health issues associated with any accumulation animal carcasses.

On February 25, 2020, the Tulare County Board of Supervisors proclaimed a Local Emergency regarding this situation. The proclamation allowed the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, to authorize conditional waivers for alternative disposal means pursuant to its Order No. R5-2018-0017 entitled "Conditional Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements for Disaster-Related Wastes during States of Emergency within the Central Valley Region."

On February 27, 2020, Tulare County was advised that Baker Commodities had completed repairs and anticipated resuming carcass pickups on March 2, 2020. Since that time, normal pickup and disposal of carcasses has resumed. Therefore, the conditions prompting the local emergency no longer exist, and the local

emergency should be terminated pursuant to the requirements of California Government code §8630(d).

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

There is no cost associated with proclaiming or terminating a local emergency. There were no extraordinary County response costs associated with this incident.

### LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Safety and Security initiative, with a directive to plan and provide coordinated emergency preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation capabilities for both natural and man-made disasters. This local emergency supported this mission and local industry by coordinating a multi-agency regulatory solution to mitigate a potential public health issue.
