REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Authorize the submission of an online grant application on April 30, 2020 to the California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways for Fiscal Year 2020/21 to purchase two inflatable boats for the Sheriff's Swiftwater Dive Rescue Team in the amount of \$16,437.00.

SUMMARY:

The Tulare County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) operates the Swiftwater Dive Rescue Team (SDRT), a specially trained emergency response unit to assist people in distress in county waterways. SDRT has been in place for many years, responding to county waterways for the rescue or recovery of people who were swept away in rapids, in danger or trapped, or had drowned. Additionally, SDRT responds to emergencies in other jurisdictions as part of the mutual aid agreement in place throughout California.

The SDRT is in need of two small gas engine inflatable boats to transport personnel and store dive related rescue equipment in both open calm waters and in fast moving rapids. These boats will allow rescuers to have anchored, stationary platforms to work off of, with easy maneuverability is small spaces, allowing for a safer environment for rescue and recovery. The boats have a shallow draft, meaning they are not deep into the water, which is extremely valuable in waterways with lots of moving debris and underwater hazards such as rocks, bushes, and trees. The boats can be moved by hand and loaded into a truck bed, inflated on

location, and placed into a waterway without the use of a trailer.

The California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways Boating Safety and Enforcement Grant program is an online application that is due by April 30, 2020. TCSO is preparing a grant application to request the purchase of two inflatable boats for use by SDRT. Today, TCSO requests that your Board give approval to submit the online grant application on April 30, 2020 for the two boats.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The Sheriff's Office is submitting a grant application for \$16,437 to purchase two inflatable boats under the Boating Safety and Enforcement Equipment Grant Program from the California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways. If approved, it is anticipated the grant would pay for the full cost of the two boats. No additional net County cost to the General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Safety and Security Initiative to provide for the safety and security of the public. The authorization to apply for a grant helps fulfill this initiative by ensuring the Sheriff's Office has the equipment it needs to provide for the safety and security of the public. If the Sheriff's grant application for the two inflatable boats are approved by the State, the equipment will contribute to this initiative.

How many outreach events did your agency participate in to promote boating safety education in 2019? Please list these events.

The TCSO Boating Safety Enforcement Unit (waterway patrol deputies) participated in a minimum of 10 outreach whole school events with members of the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers (USACE). USACE is the event organizer and responsible for the flow of waterways in our County due to the lakes/reservoirs/dams being Federal property. The USACE schedules the water safety events at County elementary and middle schools (emphasis on grades 3-8) and partners with TCSO on the dates. TCSO attends every event with deputies, brings one patrol boat/trailer and all safety equipment, along with any safety handouts USACE or TCSO may have. Students are taught about safety, calling 911, the dangerous effects of our cold swiftly flowing water from our snow covered mountains, throwing a life preserver, flotation, wearing a life vest, and hands on practice, along with a Q&A. The events emphasize boating safety and swim safety.

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Clearly identify the top three safety issues related to your request in your jurisdiction.

- 1. Use of ice cold (snow melt) rapidly flowing rivers, lakes, and canals by families or a group of people, sometimes causing hypothermia, for swimming/floating while using legal or illegal intoxicants, or unable to swim and not wearing a life vest. Victims drown or get trapped requiring rescue. We had 10 water related deaths this year, 4 due to alcohol, 1 due to a drug overdose, 4 due to the cold rapidly flowing water in the rapids, and 1 alzheimers.
- 2. Inexperience of anyone in control of a floating item (boat, tube, kayak, etc.) in a waterway to include irrigation aqueducts/canals, inability to identify potential or immediate hazards to safely supervise themselves or others in their care. We had 5 rescues using our swiftwater dive rescue team.
- 3. While operating any type of motor or human powered device on a waterway, failure to know the rules, laws, unwritten procedures, or commonly known hazards of a particular waterway, thus putting people in danger to include not requiring life vest use. We had 4 near drownings from not using a life vest.

Requesting funding to purchase two 14' inflatable boats/25hp engines.

The inflatables will be highly effective in our lakes, rivers and canals, where we had 10 drownings, 5 rescues, and 4 near drownings. They will be utilized for rescue and recovery operations involving:

- Current: light rapids (Class I-II)
- Current: heavy rapids (Class III-V) without motor and tethered from shore during technical operations
- Tight, shallow areas with heavy tree growth both in current and lake environments

Lakes Kaweah and Success are agricultural reservoirs that are open recreationally 365 days per year. Depending on time of year and water levels, there are numerous locations in both lakes that our patrol boats cannot access. Access is limited during these times due to water depths and difficult access into areas where the Kaweah and Tule Rivers feed the lakes. These areas are either very shallow or filled with dense old-growth trees. The Kings River is lined by thick old-growth forest on both banks.

During current dive operations, SDRT uses a paddle operated inflatable raft. The existing SDRT whitewater raft is too small for the required four personnel who are needed on the boat with equipment. The requested inflatables are large enough, stable enough and portable so they can be deployed in rivers/canals with or without the outboard engine depending on the operation.

The standard operating procedure and the recognized best practice for current diving operations is an inflatable boat that is tethered from shore and rigged via a reeving highline. It creates a stable operating platform for the Diver's Tender, Diver, Safety Diver and 90% Diver. It is impossible to place a full size patrol boat in our canals or County's three wild, technical rivers. The Friant Kern Canal and Kern, Tule and Kaweah Rivers are the areas Tulare County sees the majority of its rescue and recovery operations. During this fiscal year, nine of our incidents occurred in these waterways.

11 c. Describe any negative impacts to boating safety and/or boating enforcement if you do not get this grant.

The negative impact on wateway safety is the extended delay in setting up the needed equipment in the water, moving rescue personnel and equipment into position, and getting to a person for a rescue or recovery operation. The longer the delay, the more potential for a trapped victim to incur injury or death, or a drowned body to be displaced by the swift current, extending the recovery time. We currently use our small 2-person paddle operated inflatable to move divers, equipment, or rescue personnel into positions, these two boats would increase our ability tremendously.

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No other federal, state, or local agency in our county has this equipment. An adjacent county does have an inflatable boat that if requested, we could borrow, thus extending the time the person remains trapped in any of our extremely cold waterways, fed from snow covered mountains. Tulare County is the 7th largest County in CA with almost 5,000 square miles. The Sheriff's Office has 1.2 million acres of National Forest and National Park (land and waterways) within its operational jurisdiction and we responded to 17 water related incidents. The length of time to make the mutual aid request and get the inflatable to a needed location in our county could take 2-4 hours or more, depending on availability of the inflatable, the weather conditions due to our mountainous areas and heavy snow accumulation, and location of the rescue allowing for drivable road access.

11 g. How and why did you select this particular model? Explain if this is standard equipment or do you need something specialized for your waterbody to meet your agency's needs? List less expensive models considered and explain why they are not being requested.

There are various manufacturers of this type of standard inflatables and engines. We chose the Inmar Inflatable because other agencies have recommended it and we have seen it in use, we know its size, set up, storage, and capabilities. The Yamaha engine was chosen because we and other agencies have had great experiences with its reliability and our boat mechanic recommends the product and is a certified Yamaha mechanic.

This inflatable boat manufactures do make less expensive models, providing thinner fabric, more/less weight, sewn vs glued seams, varying payload capacity, weight for portability, more or less side handles for carrying, and space differences. The engine sizes and manufacturers vary, this engine will provide power and speed, the ability to maintain up stream travel or ability to stay motionless in swift moving water. TCSO will seek out the least expensive vendor and if available within driving distance, send staff there to pick up the equipment if cost effective.

This will be used in our two lakes and various swift water rapids. and on a limited basis the Friant Kern Canal, one of the primary water distribution canals in central California. It is 128 feet across and 20 feet deep when full. The Canal typically flows between 2,000CFS and 5,000CFS. Our Boating and rescue personnel are typically requested via CalOES mutual aid to assist other counties throughout the state at least 4 times a year. This fiscal year saw 5 CalOES mutual aid requests.
