SUBJECT: Approve an allocation from the California Department of Public Health

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve an allocation from the California Department of Public Health for the California Home Visiting State General Fund Expansion for Grant Allocation number 19-54 in an amount not to exceed \$2,591,664, retroactive from March 1, 2020 through June 30, 2023. The allocation is retroactive due to the timing of the receipt of the allocation documentation from the State. It was impracticable for the Board to take action prior to March 1, 2020 due to the time needed to process, prepare, and submit the agenda item.
2. Find that the Board had the authority to accept the grant funds as of March 1, 2020 and that it was in the County's best interest to accept the funding on that date.
3. Ratify the Chairman's signature on the Agency Information Form.
4. Approve the necessary budget adjustments for the California Home Visiting Program (CHVP) per the attached AUD 308 (4/5ths vote required).
5. Approve the attached Personnel Resolution adding one (1) Lead Public Health Nurse, and two (2) Health Education Specialists to the Health and Human Services Agency effective June 2, 2020.

SUBJECT: Approve an allocation from the California Department of Public Health
DATE: June 9, 2020

SUMMARY:

An amendment to Title V (Social Security Act) authorizes the Federal Health Resources & Services Administration to administer funding for the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program of which the California Home Visiting Program is a part. It is administered at the State level by the California Department of Public Health.

The California Home Visiting Program is designed for overburdened families who are at risk for Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), including child maltreatment, domestic violence, substance abuse and mental illness. Home visiting gives parents the tools and know-how to independently raise their children. It's a preventive intervention focused on promoting positive parenting and child development. Decades of research on home visiting shows that home visits by a trained professional during pregnancy and in the first years of life improves the lives of children and families by preventing child abuse and neglect, supporting positive parenting, improving maternal and child health, and promoting child development and school readiness. Giving children a solid start in their first few years of life increases the opportunity for a brighter, more prosperous future.

The Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency (HHS) Public Health Branch will be implementing the Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) program. NFP is an evidence based program that uses public health nurse home visitors to transform the lives of first time pregnant low-income mothers. The mothers receive support from early in their pregnancy through their child's second birthday. The NFP achieves significant outcomes by focusing on the following five (5) areas: 1) Teaching parenting skills and modeling parenting techniques; 2) Providing information and guidance on a range of topics, such as safe sleep position, injury prevention and nutrition; 3) Providing referrals to address substance abuse, family violence and maternal depression; 4) Screening children for developmental delays and facilitating intervention; and 5) Promoting early learning in the home that emphasizes positive parenting and building a language-rich environment.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Tulare County's annual award is \$674,916, for a total of \$2,591,664 over four (4) years. The purpose of the attached AUD 308 is to increase the HHS Fiscal Year 2019/2020 budget by \$674,916 which incorporates the programs revenues and expenses. There is no additional cost to the County General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Quality of Life Initiative that encourages innovative provision of quality supportive services for at-risk adults, youth and children in state and federally mandated programs. This allocation will benefit the residents of Tulare County by providing Public Health Services at no cost to clients. These services promote health and well-being to the residents of Tulare County.

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH), Maternal, Child and Adolescent Health (MCAH) Division intends to award your county health department with home visiting State General Fund (SGF) expansion funding. This funding is to be utilized solely for the purpose of implementing or expanding one of your local Nurse Family Partnership, Healthy Families America, or Parents as Teachers home visiting programs.

The availability of the home visiting expansion funds are based upon funds appropriated in the annual governor's budget from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2023. Reimbursement of invoice is subject to compliance with all state requirements pertaining to the CDPH/MCAH related programs and adherence to all applicable regulations, policies and procedures.

This letter of intent to award funds is being provided for planning and approval purposes only. Final funding amounts are subject to the approval and appropriation in the annual Governor's budget or approval of Federal grant funds if applicable.


