<u>SUBJECT</u>: Approve an agreement with Workforce Investment Board of Tulare County

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve an agreement with Workforce Investment Board of Tulare County for the Welfare to Work Expanded Subsidized Employment Program, in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000 for the provision of expanded work opportunities to CalWORKs recipients effective July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.
- 2. Authorize the Chair of the Board to sign one (1) copy of the agreement.

SUMMARY:

The Expanded Subsidized Employment Program will provide services to adults in Tulare County that receive CalWORKs assistance payments and are required to engage in employment services related activities to continue receiving benefits. Assembly Bill 74 (2013) provides for several "Early Engagement" Welfare to Work strategies, including family stabilization services and Expanded Subsidized Employment. Partnerships with local community organizations, including Workforce Investment Boards, have been encouraged and identified as best practice by the California Department of Social Services.

This agreement provides Expanded Subsidized Employment activities for clients, including up to six (6) months of subsidized employment potentially leading to unsubsidized employment. Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) will refer eligible participants to Workforce Investment Board (WIB) who are

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likely to benefit from this program and become self-sufficient. HHSA will monitor the ongoing success of this program through detailed reporting of participation and successful outcomes.

The 2020/2021 agreement will serve a minimum of 210 new participants in Welfare to Work activities contingent upon TulareWORKs referring a minimum of 350 participants. Provider will place participants in activities such that 75% are meeting the average participation rate of twenty-two (22) hours per week for a one-parent Assistance Unit with a child under age six (6), thirty-two (32) hours per week for a one-parent Assistance Unit with no child under six (6), and 38 hours per week for a two-parent Assistance Unit.

Under the current agreement, through a collaborative partnership with WIB and other providers, WIB has enrolled 75 participants into the program through February 2020. This agreement did not include a Request For Proposal process because WIB is one of four primary providers for Welfare to Work engagement with CalWORKs participants.

The following term deviates substantively from standard County boilerplate; WIB is contractually eligible to subcontract with other providers within the community.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The budgeted costs associated with this agreement are included in the 2020/2021 HHSA budget, line 001-142-4032, professional services, for \$2,000,000. The cost per client is approximately \$9,524. The funding is derived from Temporary Assistance to Needy Families, and is covered by State and Federal allocations. There is no additional net cost to the County General Fund.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Quality of Life Initiative that encourages innovative provision of quality supportive services for at-risk adults, youth, and children in state and federally mandated programs. This agreement increases the ability to fulfill that obligation by providing a wide range of employment services that support clients in the transition to self-sufficiency.
