**SUBJECT:** Approve an agreement with Turning Point of Central California, Inc

**REQUEST(S):**

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve an agreement with Turning Point of Central California, Inc. for the North County One-Stop Center, in an amount not to exceed \$700,000, from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.
2. Authorize the Chair of the Board to sign one (1) copy of the agreement.

**SUMMARY:**

The Tulare County Health & Human Services Agency (HHS), Mental Health Branch, collaborates with Turning Point of Central California, Inc. to provide mental health services through the North County One-Stop Center under the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Community Services and Supports (CSS) component.

The North County One-Stop Center is designed to offer a wide array of integrated services to youth ages 12 to 15 years, and transitional age youth (TAY) ages 16 to 25 years. The One-Stop program delivers a Children’s System of Care Model that promotes the integration of mental health services and quality of life approaches such as employment, education, drug/alcohol counseling, and life skills training. It is estimated that 130 unduplicated consumers will receive services in addition to participating in community outreach and engagement opportunities.

Tulare County Mental Health Branch released a Request for Proposal (RFP) in April 2013 for the North County One Stop. Through the proposal process, two proposals were received. After review of the proposals, the RFP Review Team recommended

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Turning Point be awarded the contract. Turning Point has been continually providing services to youth and TAY in Tulare County since being awarded the initial contract in 2006.

The prior agreement, identical for the term or time period , was approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 25, 2019. An amendment attaching Exhibit B-5, was approved by the Board of Supervisors on November 19, 2019. The substantive deviations from the standard County boilerplate identified in the prior agenda items were none. The proposed renewal agreement does not include any additional deviations from the standard County boilerplate.

The only change from the previous agreement and amendment are to the time period of the agreement from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. The total price for services has not changed.

**FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:**

The budgeted costs associated with this agreement will be included in the HHSA 3331 budget, line 7052 medical providers in an amount not to exceed \$700,000 for Fiscal Year 2020-2021. The average estimated cost per consumer is \$5,385. The estimated cost may vary based on actual utilization. This agreement is paid through State Medical reimbursement and Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) revenues. There is no additional net cost to the County General Fund.

**LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:**

The County's five-year plan includes the Quality of Life initiative to promote and encourage the provision of quality supportive services for individuals in Tulare County. The North County One Stop program will benefit the residents of Tulare County by providing mental health services that promote health and well-being to the youth and TAY so that they can grow up to become independent adults and productive members of society.
