SUBJECT: Acceptance of Donation for Traffic Signal Equipment from Daly City's

Public Works Department

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Accept the Donation of Fifteen (15)—210 Conflict Monitors and Fifteen (15)—170E Traffic Signal Controllers, with a total estimated donation value of \$3,000, from Daly City's Public Works Department to the County of Tulare; and
- 2. Authorize the Chair to sign the Letter of Release of Liability.

SUMMARY:

The County of Tulare currently owns and maintains a fleet of twenty-five (25) traffic signals located throughout the County. In the fleet, all the traffic signals use a 210 Conflict Monitor and a 170E Traffic Signal Controller. These components, the conflict monitor and traffic signal controller, are being phased out of production causing them to become increasingly difficult to purchase. The County has a limited surplus on hand of these components; therefore, staff would like to build reserves to ensure our signals will remain operational until such time upgrades are possible.

County staff became aware that Daly City was in the process of downsizing their excess signal equipment inventory. Daly City expressed their desire to donate to Resource Management Agency, Public Works division: fifteen (15)—210 Conflict Monitors and fifteen (15)—170E Traffic Signal Controllers. Staff recommends the County utilize this opportunity to increase current signal component inventory.

As such, when accepting donations, the County of Tulare must follow Administrative Regulation No.37: a policy to establish thresholds for accepting donations. In line with our policies, Daly City is requiring the County to sign a Release of Liability. In this Release of Liability, Tulare County would agree to release from liability, hold harmless and indemnify the City of Daly City from any claims, legal actions, losses, damages, and liabilities arising from the condition or subsequent use of the conflict monitors and controllers donated to the County. Therefore, we ask the Board to sign the Letter of Release of Liability from Daly City.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

No Net County Cost to the General Fund.

Any costs associated with this donation will be covered by Local Roads funds.
