# REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve the Tulare County Council on Child & Youth Development 2020 Zip Code Priorities Report.
- 2. Authorize the Chair of the Board to sign two (2) copies each of the Local Planning Council County Priorities Report Form.

# SUMMARY:

On June 18, 1998, Pursuant to the Statutes of 1997, Assembly Bill 1542, the Tulare County Board of Supervisors approved and established the Local Child Care Planning and Development Council (LPC). The LPC is composed of twenty-five members; thirteen members are appointed by Tulare County Board of Supervisors and twelve members are appointed by the Superintendent of Schools. Per legislative directive, the LPC membership is divided into five categories; Public Agency Representative, Community Representative, Consumer Representative, Child Care Provider and Discretionary Appointee.

It is the responsibility of the Tulare County Council on Child & Youth Development to determine the impact of increased numbers of working families on the local child care supply; to assess the unique child care and early education needs of each county; and to increase the availability and quality of such services. According to the 2018 needs assessment, the most recent available, the Tulare County Council

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on Child & Youth Development serves as an advocate for the child care needs of 103,745 children, ages 0-12, in Tulare County.

When the legislation does not identify specific target populations or geographic areas to be served in allocating expansion funds, the State Child Development Division will use priorities identified by the Tulare County Council on Child & Youth Development for the purpose of allocating new state and federal funds within each county.

The Council is mandated to submit priorities to the state annually. In the event that the priorities change from the previous year, the Council is mandated to hold a public hearing and submit the priorities to the Board of Supervisors and Superintendent of Schools for approval prior to submitting them to the state. The priorities have been revised for 2020. The Council held a Public hearing regarding the Priorities on July 9, 2020, which included the public posting of the hearing agenda 72 hours prior to the meeting as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act of California.

The Tulare County Superintendent of School has approved the priorities and it is recommended that the Tulare County Board of Supervisors approve and authorize the Chair to approve the Tulare County Council on Child & Youth Development 2020 Zip Code Priorities Report forms.

# FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

There is no fiscal impact associated with this Zip Code Priorities Report. There is no additional net cost to the County General Fund.

# LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Quality of Life Initiative that encourages quality education opportunities for all county residents. The zip code priorities of the Tulare County Council on Child & Youth Development increases the ability to fulfill this obligation by ensuring that the child care needs of all children are identified and met.

# 2020-2021 LPC Goals

- Continue to develop, collaborate, and implement supports in the area of early care and education for parents and providers, regardless of funding source.
- Raise awareness and visibility of the council and its work through the use of outreach efforts in the community.
- Stay abreast of updates and opportunities in the field that impact the council's beliefs.

We believe that all children and families deserve quality care and education. The Council supports quality care and education by providing the link between the needs and the available resources.

# TULARE COUNTY COUNCIL ON CHILD & YOUTH DEVELOPMENT MANDATES

- Conduct an assessment of child care needs at least once every five years. The needs assessment shall meet the requirements as specified in Education Code, Section 8499.5.
- Document information gathered during the needs assessment which shall include, but need not be limited to, data on supply, demand, cost, and
  market rates for each category of child care in the county.
- Submit the results of the needs assessment and the local priorities identified by the LPC to the CBS and CSS for approval before submitting them to CDE.
- Prepare a comprehensive countywide child care plan designed to mobilize public and private resources to address identified needs.
- Encourage public input in the development of priorities. Opportunities for public input shall include at least one public hearing during which members of the public can comment on the proposed priorities.
- · Conduct a periodic review of child care programs funded by the CDE and CDSS to determine if identified priorities are being met.
- Collaborate with all interested parties, including, but not be limited to subsidized and non-subsidized child care providers, county welfare
  departments, human service agencies, regional centers, job training programs, employers, integrated child and family service councils, local
  and state children and families commissions, parent organizations, early start family resource centers, family empowerment centers on
  disabilities, and local child care resource and referral programs to foster partnerships designed to meet local child care needs.
- Facilitate community-based efforts to coordinate part-day programs, including state preschool and Head Start, with other child care and development services to provide full-day, full-year child care and development services based on guidelines and funding models approved by state and federal agencies.
- Develop and implement a training plan to provide increased efficiency, productivity, and facilitation of LPC meetings.
- Design a system to consolidate local child care waiting lists, if a centralized eligibility list is not already in existence.
- Identify at least one, but not more than two, members to serve as part of the department team that reviews and scores proposals for the
  provision of services funded through contracts with the department. Local planning council representatives may not review and score proposals
  from the geographic area covered by their own local planning council. The department shall notify each local planning council whenever this
  opportunity is available.
