# **SUBJECT**: Authorize the submittal of a 2020 Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus Response Round 1 application

#### REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Hold a Public Hearing at 9:30 a.m., or as soon thereafter as it can be heard, on August 25, 2020, to approve an application for funding from the State Department of Housing and Community Development 2020 Community Development Block Grant - Coronavirus Response Round 1, in the amount of \$490,166 for the provision of Subsistence Payments.
- 2. Adopt the attached Resolution.
- 3. Authorize and approve the use of Program Income funds not to exceed \$600,000.
- 4. Authorize and direct the Chairman of the Board to sign the completed application with refinements as necessary and accompanying documents on behalf of the County.
- 5. Authorize and direct the County Administrative Officer to act on the County's behalf in all matters pertaining to this application.
- 6. Authorize and direct the Resource Management Agency Director and Associate Director to sign Funds Requests and other required reporting forms.

SUBJECT: Authorize the submittal of a 2020 Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus Response Round 1 applicationDATE: August 25, 2020

#### SUMMARY:

On June 5, 2020, the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) announced the availability of approximately \$18.7 million in new federal funds for the Community Development Block Grant - Coronavirus Response Round 1 (CDBG-CV1) funding for local assistance. Funding for the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) is made available pursuant to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act signed into law March 27, 2020. Applications for funding must be submitted to HCD no later than Monday, August 31, 2020. The CARES Act provides CDBG-CV1 funding specifically targeted to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus.

Funds from this CDBG-CV1 funding cycle are available to eligible applicants via allocations through a non-competitive process. The County of Tulare's allocation is \$490,166. CDBG Program Income must be spent completely prior to spending CDBG-CV1 dollars. The County currently has approximately \$430,000 of Program Income (PI) funds on hand but is allocating an amount not to exceed \$600,000 to this project amount should additional PI be received over the term of the grant. This will allow the use of any additional PI received between now and the project completion date without having to amend the grant agreement. The potential amount of funding for this program could be up to \$1.1 million.

#### **Eligible Activities**

Activities funded under this NOFA will have a 12-month expenditure period and must show a relationship between the need for services and COVID-19 impacts. For the CDBG-CV1 NOFA, the following activities are permitted:

#### Community Development

- 1. Public services to respond to COVID-19 impacts
- 2. Public facility improvements to increase capacity for healthcare facilities
- 3. Public facility acquisition, provided that the end use increases healthcare facility capacity
- 4. Acquisition and/or improvement of housing facilities for persons experiencing homelessness

Economic Development with focus on job retention

- 1. Business Assistance
- 2. Microenterprise Assistance

#### Public Services – Subsistence Payments

Staff is proposing to apply for a Public Services Activity to provide Subsistence Payments to low and moderate-income households in the unincorporated areas of Tulare County that have been affected by the impacts of COVID-19, such as loss or reduction in income. Assistance will include payment of rent or mortgage payments and/or utilities for up to six months. Payments will be made directly to the landlord, mortgage company and the utility providers.

# SUBJECT:Authorize the submittal of a 2020 Community Development Block Grant<br/>Coronavirus Response Round 1 applicationDATE:August 25, 2020

If authorized, the County would enter into a Subrecipient Agreement with Self-Help Enterprises (SHE) to administer this program. Once the County receives the grant agreement and authority to spend grant funds, SHE will advertise the program extensively. Additionally, guidelines governing the implementation of this program will have to be established. Staff will return at a later date for the approval of the Subrecipient Agreement with SHE and the approval of program guidelines governing Subsistence Payments. It is expected that subsistence payments would be made available around October 15, 2020 with a one year grant term. The County will not be able to kick off the program until the grant agreement has been fully executed.

Given the short time frame regarding this funding, from NOFA release, to application due date, to 12-month grant term, Public Services is the best activity to be successfully implemented. County staff from multiple departments have attended several webinars and reached out to HCD staff with various ideas, such as rehabilitation of a motel for homeless housing, that were found not to be a good fit for CDBG-CV1 funding.

#### Duplication of Benefits

Currently numerous local agencies, including Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) are providing a similar or same type of service. A duplication of benefits occurs when a program beneficiary receives assistance from multiple sources for a cumulative amount that exceeds the total need for assistance. It will be the County's Subrecipient's responsibility to ensure that each application will receive assistance only to the extent that needs have not been met by another source. Program applicants will have to certify under penalty of periury the amount of income as well as any other assistance they are currently receiving in order to avoid any duplication of benefits. The assistance program funded through HHSA will be administered by United Way and only provides rental and utility assistance. This program will expire on 12/31/20 and has a priority focus on those at risk of homelessness as well as individuals over the age of 60. RMA's program will provide assistance to low and moderate income households and can include mortgage assistance. Additionally, RMA's funding agreement is expected to expire in late 2021. Therefore, the risk of duplication of benefits between the two Countysponsored programs is minimal.

#### **CDBG National Objectives**

The CDBG Program is designed to meet the national objectives of benefit to low/moderate income group households, including minority, handicapped and elderly; to eliminate slums and blight; or to meet urgent community development needs. The County's 2020 CDBG-CV1 grant application will benefit low/moderate income group households as defined by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) CDBG Income Limits that are directly affected by the impacts of COVID-19.

#### **Citizen Participation**

The CDBG required notice of public hearing was published in the Visalia Times Delta on Wednesday, August 19, 2020. A copy of the Public Notice is contained in Attachment "C".

When the Public Hearing is opened, citizens are encouraged to ask questions and provide input regarding the County's application. Citizens are also invited to submit written comments regarding the CDBG Program and the County's application to Tulare County RMA, 5961 South Mooney Boulevard, Visalia, CA 93277.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Preparation of the application will be paid from Budget No. 001-230-4215. There is no net County cost to the General Fund. If authorized approximately, \$1.1m of CDBG funds consisting of existing Program Income and CDBG-CV1 revenue would be made available for the program. Of this total, County and subrecipient administrative costs would not exceed \$83,328, the remainder of the funds would be made available for subsistence payments. All Program Income is required to be spent prior to CDBG-CV1 revenues.

The proposed grant activities will continue to improve the Quality of Life by providing decent, safe and affordable housing, and economic development opportunities within Tulare County.
