REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Terminate the Local Emergency due to Animal Mortality, Resolution No. 2020-0537

SUMMARY:

Tulare County and much of the State experienced an extreme heat wave in mid-August, resulting in power shortages, fires, and increased animal mortality among other impacts. The Tulare County Director of Emergency Services proclaimed a local emergency on August 19, 2020 due to the increased animal mortality and limited availability of disposal options. This proclamation allowed for temporary use of alternative disposal methods as permitted by State regulations. The Tulare County Board of Supervisors ratified this proclamation on August 25, 2020 pursuant to California Government Code §8630(c).

Since that time, excessive heat conditions have abated, and disposal options are no longer constrained. The State's Quarantine Order expired on August 31, 2020, and the conditions of emergency no longer exists within Tulare County. Staff recommends termination of the local emergency pursuant to the requirements of California Government Code §8630(d).

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

There is no cost associated with terminating a local emergency. There have been no identified extraordinary County response costs associated with this incident.
