Re: Tulare County Fiscal Year 2008 Appropriations Priorities

On behalf of the Tulare County Board of Supervisors, attached are summaries of our top appropriations priorities for Fiscal Year 2008.

1. Farm-to-Market Roads - Rehabilitation

This request includes the rehabilitation of surface transportation of key Tulare County Farm to Market roads. Funding would result in enhancing the transportation of fam products to consumers.

2. ACTION Project – San Joaquin Valley Rural Crime Prevention Program

This request is for continued funding to combat agricultural crime in the nation's leading farm production region.

3. Marijuana Eradication Funding

Funding request to help offset investigation and eradication of marijuana from public and private lands in Tulare County.

4. TANF Exception for Welfare to Work Job Search Program

This would extend the Welfare to Work Job Search requirements from 6 weeks to 12 weeks for Tulare County because of our high poverty rates.

5. 330 Grants excluding letters of support

The requirement for letters of support from the other local FQHCs for 330 grant applications would be eliminated under this request.

6. Interoperability

Funding would allow all Tulare County emergency services to be compatible with each other.

7. Lake Success Dam Remediation

This request would provide for the construction of a new dam at Lake Success.
