REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Accept the 2007 Grant Funding from the Indian Gaming Local Community Benefit Committee, SB 621 Local Government Mitigation Funding in the amount of:

\$270,000 to the Tulare County Fire Department for the purchase of digital pagers, communications gear and other emergency response equipment; \$50,000 to the Resource Management Agency for road maintenance on Reservation Road; and \$15,039 to the Resource Management Agency for the Tulare County Museum preservation project; and

2. Authorize the necessary budget adjustments.

SUMMARY:

On March 9, 2004, your Board, pursuant to SB 621 Chapter 858 (2003), created the Indian Gaming Local Community Benefit Committee. The committee is responsible for developing application policies and procedures for the distribution of grant funding; assessing the applications; and setting reimbursements for county administrative costs. The committee has provided public notification regarding the

availability of 2007 grant funds for local jurisdictions that are defined as a County, a city, or a special district.

All grant applications were required to include a sponsorship letter from the Tule River Indian Tribal Council in order to be eligible for approval by the committee. The Tule River Tribal Council submitted a letter on March 20, 2007 indicating sponsorship of the three County grant awards presented for your consideration, (Attachment A). The committee approved the grant applications and funding agreements at their April 5, 2007 meeting.

The State Controller has notified the committee that for 2007 funding, \$545,957 is available from SB621 funds held by the state in the Tule River Reservation Tribal Casino Account. The State Controller disburses grant award funding directly to the locally approved grant recipients or before June 30, 2007. The County receives 2% from each fund for administrative costs; in 2007 this totals \$10,917.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

From the available 2007 funding, the Indian Gaming Local Benefit Committee has awarded three grants totaling \$335,039 to Tulare County. These are: \$270,000 to the Tulare County Fire Department for the purchase of digital pagers, communications gear and other emergency response equipment; \$50,000 to the Resource Management Agency for road maintenance on Reservation Road, and \$15,039 to the Resource Management Agency for the Tulare County Museum preservation project. No County match is required for these grants; However, the Resource Management Agency has pledged a 25 percent "in-kind" labor match for its \$50,000 road repair project.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

Accepting these grants helps provide for the safety and security of the public by providing the Tulare County Fire Department with additional emergency response capacity and by enabling safety improvements to Reservation Road. Accepting funding for the Resource Management Agency's historical preservation project advances the quality of life and educational opportunities of the public.
