## REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Authorize the establishment of a Trust Fund No. 456 designated for 15% of all State asset forfeitures received as specified in Health & Safety Code, Section 11489.

#### **SUMMARY:**

The Sheriff's Department receives qualifying asset forfeitures through joint investigations with state and federal agencies. The goal of asset forfeiture is to remove the profits from those who benefit from the illegal drug trade. Asset forfeitures relate to the money from illegal drug transactions that are seized during law enforcement operations. These funds are shared between the abovementioned agencies, local law enforcement and the prosecuting agency. The majority of asset forfeitures received by the Sheriff's Department are distributed by federal agencies. The Department receives minimal State asset forfeitures.

Per Health & Safety Code 11489, 15% of all State forfeitures received, are to be deposited in a special fund that must be used for the sole purpose of funding programs designed to combat drug abuse and divert gang activity, and shall, whenever possible, involve educators, parents, community-based organizations and

local businesses. The newly established trust fund will be used exclusively for this purpose.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

There will be no net County cost.

## LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Safety and Security Initiative to collaborate with school districts, cities and community-based nonprofit organizations to promote early intervention for youth involved in gang activities. The 15% revenue received from the State asset forfeitures deposited into the trust fund will be used for the sole purpose of funding programs designed to combat drug abuse and divert gang activity in the County.
