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SUBJECT:

Approval of agreement with San Joaquin Valley College for a clinical training program.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Ratify and approve the agreement with San Joaquin Valley College for a clinical training program for students enrolled in licensed vocational nursing classes, retroactive to October 1, 2007 through September 30, 2012.
- 2. Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed agreement as of October 1, 2007 and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the agreement on that date.
- 3. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign three (3) copies of the agreement.

SUMMARY:

San Joaquin Valley College operates fully accredited licensed vocational nursing classes and is in need of facilities to provide supervised experience for the students enrolled in said classes. Tulare County Health and Human Services (HHSA) has clinical facilities in Tulare and Visalia suitable for the educational needs of the San

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Joaquin Valley College's programs. Tulare County HHSA currently allows students the opportunity to gain work experience in their selected fields of study. Students are used to enhance county programs, and are not to displace allocated staff. Students are allowed to intern as non-paid, paraprofessional seeking hours for licensure in their field of expertise. Past programs have been provided for Nursing candidates. This program is also beneficial to the enhancement of the County recruitment process by encouraging students to join the Program with the hopes of future employment. All functions of the program are conducted in accordance with County and Agency policy and procedural guidelines. Students are utilized in various areas within the Agency such as Nursing, Social Work, and Physician's Assistants. These classifications are all considered hard to fill and this tool is a positive way to recruit future employees.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

There is no cost to HHSA associated with this Program. No Net County Cost.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Economic Well-Being initiative that promotes a quality standard of living by collaborating in developing and sustaining a well-qualified labor pool. This agreement increases the ability to fulfill this obligation.

ALTERNATIVES:

The Board could choose not to approve this Agreement, but that is not recommended because the benefits of providing these services lie in accordance with the Strategic Plan of Tulare County.
