SUBJECT:

Amended Agreement with California Department of Pesticide

Regulation.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Ratify, approve, and authorize the Chairman to sign a \$98,908 amended agreement (Number 08-0050C) with the California Department of Pesticide Regulation for electronic submittal of pesticide use report records, retroactive to July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.
- 2. Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed agreement as of July 1, 2008, and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the agreement on that date.
- 3. Authorize the Chairman to sign Form CCC-307 (Contractor Certification Clauses).

SUMMARY:

Both pest control operators and growers are required by law to file use reports with the agricultural commissioner in the county where they make the applications. estimate dietary risk as well as exposure and potential risk to workers increased dramatically during the late 1980s. The Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) began the full use-reporting program in 1990 in response to these concerns. Under the program, all agricultural pesticide use must be reported monthly to the county agricultural commissioner who in turn reports the data to DPR. The reports must include the date and location where the application was made, and detail the kind and amount of pesticides used. If the pesticide is applied to a crop, the type of commodity must be specified. In addition, identification numbers (IDs) for the site and the pesticide user ("operator") are required. Planted acres are also required, which in combination with the treated acres, are useful in pesticide risk assessment. Before buying or using pesticides, every operator is required to obtain a unique operator ID from each county in which pest control work will be performed. Growers obtain a site ID from the county agricultural commissioner for each location and crop/commodity where pest control work will be performed, and it is recorded on the restricted material permit or other approved form.

California has a broad legal definition of "agricultural use," so the reporting requirements include pesticide applications to parks, golf courses, cemeteries, rangeland, pastures, and along roadside and railroad rights-of-way. In addition, all post harvest pesticide treatments of agricultural commodities must be reported, along with all pesticide treatments in poultry and fish production, as well as some livestock applications. Structural pest control operators, professional gardeners, and other nonagricultural pest control operators also must report all pesticide use. The primary exceptions to the full use reporting requirements are home and garden use and most industrial and institutional uses.

This "amended" Agreement is intended to render financial aid to the County for it's ongoing program of electronically submitting to the California Department of Pesticide Regulation reports of pesticide applications made in Tulare County. The attached agreement continues this long-standing program for fiscal year 2008/2009.

The Board approved the "original" agreement on August 12, 2008 (Resolution No. 2008-0584 - Tulare County Agreement No. 23679), but was never fully executed by DPR. The amendment has been deemed necessary because of a change in the payment schedule.

This Contract is to be retroactively approved because of the late date received from the State.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The County will receive \$98,908 in state subvention funds if this agreement is approved. State revenues and the associated expenditures for this ongoing program have been included in the Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer's fiscal year 2008/2009 budget request. There is zero net county cost for this program.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:
