SUBJECT:

Amendment to the Ordinance Code of Tulare County Pertaining to the Maintenance and Safety of Railroad Crossings

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. On December 9, 2008, introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance amendment subsections (a) and (b) of Section 3-07-1160 and adding Section 3-07-1167 to Article 7 of Chapter 7 of Part III of the Ordinance Code of Tulare County pertaining to the Maintenance and Safety of Railroad Crossings
- 2. On December 16, 2008, waive the second reading of an ordinance amendment subsections (a) and (b) of Section 3-07-1160 and adding Section 3-07-1167 to Article 7 of Chapter 7 of Part III of the Ordinance Code of Tulare County pertaining to the Maintenance and Safety of Railroad Crossings

SUMMARY:

Article 7 of Chapter 7 of Part III of the Ordinance Code of Tulare County addresses excavations and obstructions in County highways and requires an encroachment permit for construction in the rights of way in County highways. The proposed ordinance clarifies existing County regulations pertaining to use, construction and demolition activities within the right of ways of County highways, particularly in regard to railroad facilities in railroad rights of ways intersecting County highways

SUBJECT: Railroad Crossings **DATE**: December 9, 2008

and rights of way.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Construction activities by other parties within a County right of way are subject to the County's encroachment permit requirements. Encroachment permits are subject to fees and would therefore provide revenue to the County. This program is administered by the Tulare County Resource Management Agency.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

Adoption of the proposed ordinance will promote personal responsibility for public safety and assist to improve and maintain adequate transportation infrastructure.

ALTERNATIVES:

- 1. The Board could decline to adopt this ordinance and direct staff to take other action.
- 2. The Board could modify the proposed ordinance provisions before adoption.

INVOLVEMENT OF OTHER DEPARTMENTS OR AGENCIES:

The Tulare County Resource Management Agency and the Director of Transportation will be charged with carrying out these proposed ordinance code provisions.
